






#### **YOUTH CONCLAVE 2021**

#### **CONCLAVE 2021: EDUCATIONAL METAMORPHOSIS**










School of Planning and Development, Sushant University organized the first-of-its-kind academia and practitioners led 'Conclave 2021: Educational



### A BRIEF ACCOUNT OF THE

2041 MASTER PLAN FOR DELHI

August 2021 Publication

Coinciding with the 75th year of India's Independence, beith, the capital city of India, has published the Draft Delhi 2063. Muster Plan (MPD 2043) fee public consultation. The MPD 2043, sets the direction of growth for the city in the next twenty years and is especially relevant to take an Informed view on the future of the second largest when egglomeration in the world after Tokyo. The MPD 2043 document mentions the base year population of 20.6 million, which is forecasted to mustigly 1.5 stees to 30 million by 2041.

It appears that the MPD 2041 is built on a trend-based population growth forecast model rather than setting the plan based on a strategy-driven growth forecast. It is interesting to remark that some references suggest flat. Delhi. Urban. Agglomeration's population is currently around 30 million. A hostisc view of the urban agglomeration could have presented a better view while drafting the growth agenda for such a large city (Region).


Looking at the document's structure, it seems the MPO 2041 tries to align with the national-level systematic urban development policies. With a vision to foster a sustainable, livrable, and vibrant Delhi, MPO 2041 seems to identify the issues at the core but still needs details on implementation strategies for the visions and priorities set out in the document.

Standing on the three piliars of economic viability, environmental protection, and social equity, the plan considers the city's cultural, social, and economic differences, including the unauthorised colonies, high land prices, power consumption, water scarcity, and mobility hindrances. The goals for 2041 are to become environmentally sustainable, future-ready, and a dynamic place for economic, creative, and cultural development.


#### The utopian vision

The vision document incorporates all the essential therecteristics of a resident city. It is public certric and based on inclusivity, equity, and sustainability, emphasizing asse of multity. The document has hostistally covered the estiming, spooming, and exclopated drivers of urban regeneration and development. How far the authorities could implement these strategies would be interesting to note.

The MPD 2041 also focuses on delineating "The Green Development Area", a combination of a Green Belt (a planning strategy inspired by London) to create a regional environmental buffer and Low-density residential areas in urban wilages. The primary objective in this zone is to footer city-levels histo present binds and recreation. The efforts taken as part of the "green development" such as supporting urban familing, reducing pollution, and rejuvenating natural assets also promote the city's goals for environmental sustainability. Since the Green Belt is fiely to create a regional environmental buffer, the plan highly encourages the production of food and other natural produce to meet the harticultural needs of the city. 




