Off-Campus Independent Study



Our study trip to Madhya Pradesh, which took place from January 7 to January 13, 2025, was demanding but incredibly fulfilling. We experienced the rich architectural legacy and cultural fabric of the area as we travelled to Maheshwar, Mandu, and Bhopal. Every location provided a fresh viewpoint by fusing craftsmanship, history, and the spirit of community. After an overnight train journey from Delhi to Indore, we arrived in the historic town of Maheshwar.

We all worked in groups which helped us bond as peers. The site had a contagious spirit, particularly during our on-site group drafting, which drew interested bystanders and highlighted the importance of our job. As we explored the fort's hallways, we learned about the history of Maheshwar's kings while taking in the intricate carvings and the building's harmonious blend with the surrounding landscape.

For many of us, Mandu was the high point. We were taken back in time as soon as we entered Jahaz Mahal. Its elaborate design was captivating; it was the ideal illustration of how architecture can convey both poetry and power. Every building in Mandu had a story to tell, and exploring the city was a balance between learning and discovery. We captured the spirit of this historical wonder through our observations, discussions, and sketches.

Following days of rigorous fieldwork, Bhopal provided a welcome respite. The time we spent at Forn Residency seemed like a well-earned break. We learned more about space and culture from the city's architectural treasures. We observed how tradition and modernity coexisted while touring Upper Lake, the MP Tribal Museum, and the Vidhan Sabha, reflecting Madhya Pradesh's changing character.

This trip was about teamwork, adaptation, and perspective and was more than just an academic exercise. It deepened our sense of how history influences the built environment, improved our knowledge of architectural heritage, and fortified our ties to one another. As I think back on these encounters, I see that architecture is about more than simply buildings; it's about the people they serve and the stories they tell.



THIMPU, BHUTAN

Off-Campus Independent Study

Our educational trip to Bhutan was an unforgettable journey that combined architectural exploration, cultural immersion, and community engagement. From the moment we crossed into the "Land of the Peaceful Thunder Dragon," we were captivated by its serene landscapes, warm hospitality, and unique way of life. The journey provided a holistic understanding of Bhutan's harmonious balance between tradition and progress.

We began our exploration with an introduction to Bhutanese architecture, visiting iconic structures such as Dzongs, monasteries, and traditional houses. The distinct style of Bhutanese architecture, characterized by its intricate wood carvings, multicolored facades, sloping roofs, and the absence of nails or iron bars, reflects the country's deep-rooted spiritual and cultural values. Visiting places like the Royal College of Thimphu and Selekha Heritage House, we delved into the architectural practices that have been preserved for centuries. Through sketches and site studies, we documented the interplay between Bhutan's topography and its construction techniques.

Our journey took us to key landmarks such as Punakha Dzong, the structure stood as a testament to Bhutan's rich history and architectural brilliance. The breathtaking views from Dochu-La Pass, the intricate artwork at the National Museum offered deeper insights into Bhutan's cultural heritage. Along the way, we observed how traditional elements are seamlessly integrated into modern contexts, ensuring that progress does not overshadow tradition.



THIMPU, BHUTAN

Engaging with the local community added a deeply human layer to our trip. We spent time talking to shopkeepers, farmers, college students, working people and even monks, trying to understand their way of life. Their simplicity, kindness, and contentment left us humbled. Many shared their views on how Bhutan could grow without losing its soul. Some spoke about the need for better infrastructure, while others emphasized preserving the natural beauty and traditions that define their identity. These conversations gave us a fresh perspective on how architecture and planning can go beyond buildings to create spaces that truly serve people.

Walking across the suspension bridge to reach Punakha Dzong felt like stepping back in time. The Dzong, surrounded by blooming jacaranda trees, stood as a testament to Bhutan's rich history. Sitting by the river afterward, sketching the structure and reflecting on its significance, we couldn't help but marvel at how Bhutan seamlessly weaves its past into its present.

The markets and streets of Bhutan were equally fascinating. The vibrant colors, the aroma of momos and butter tea, and the sound of traditional music made every stroll an adventure. At one market, a local vendor told us how much she valued the peace and happiness that Bhutan offers, even if life could sometimes be challenging. Her words stayed with us as a reminder of how deeply Bhutanese culture prioritizes well-being over materialism.

By the end of the trip, Bhutan had left an indelible mark on all of us. It wasn't just the stunning landscapes or the architectural marvels—it was the people, their stories, and their way of life that truly moved us. This journey taught us that architecture isn't just about designing spaces; it's about understanding the soul of a place and creating something that resonates with the people who live there.



TOKYO, JAPAN

Off-Campus Independent Study

Third Year B.Arch. Students | Sushant University

The Off-Campus Independent Study for the third-year B.Arch. students of Sushant University was an eight-day immersive journey into the architectural landscape of Tokyo, beginning on 6th January 2025. Stepping into the futuristic yet deeply rooted city, we landed at Narita International Airport, eager to witness the seamless integration of tradition and innovation that defines Japan's built environment. Our first stop was Odaiba, a vibrant artificial island known for its bold urban planning and avant-garde structures, setting the stage for the architectural discourse that would unfold over the coming days.

The study focused on the pioneering works of Kisho Kurokawa. Toyo Ito, and Kenzo Tange, alongside an in-depth exploration of the Metabolism Movement, which redefined post-war Japanese architecture. The city became our classroom, with each structure narrating its own story of innovation, adaptability, and cultural significance.

Among the highlights was Tokyo Cathedral, where Kenzo Tange's sculptural mastery transformed concrete into an ethereal experience of light and form. The Tokyo Metropolitan Government Building, with its monumental twin towers, embodied structural prowess and urban symbolism. At Meguro Sky Garden, we explored the seamless integration of green spaces within dense urban infrastructure, while the Tokyo Skytree stood as a testament to Japan's engineering ambitions, rising as the tallest structure of its kind.

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TOKYO, JAPAN

Off-Campus Independent Study

Moving through the city, we explored **Za-Koenji** Public Theatre, where Toyo Ito's fluid, organic spaces redefined performance architecture, and the Tokyo International Forum, a striking blend of glass and steel merging aesthetics with functionality. At **Tokyo Big Sight**, we engaged with Japan's forward-thinking approach to large-scale exhibitions, while **Yoyogi National Gymnasium** stood as a testament to Kenzo Tange's structural ingenuity and Olympic legacy.

Beyond these landmarks, the journey provided insight into Tokyo's evolving public spaces. **Miyashita Park**, an elevated green oasis, challenged conventional notions of recreation in high-density cities. **Omotesando Keyaki** unfolded as a dynamic display of contemporary architectural experimentation, while the towering **Azabudai Hills** and **Toranomon Hills** reflected Tokyo's shift toward futuristic mixeduse developments.

Further along, **Tokyo Mode Gakuen**, with its twisting sculptural form, pushed the boundaries of architectural expression, while visits to **Shizuoka Shinbun** and **Daiwa Ubiquitous** highlighted Tokyo's seamless integration of corporate and contextual architecture.

This eight-day exploration was more than an academic study—it was a deep dive into Tokyo's architectural evolution, revealing how design continuously adapts to time, technology, and culture. As we departed, we carried a renewed perspective on architecture's role in shaping the urban future.
