The International Planning and Architecture Conclave (IPAC), an academic event hosted by Sushant School of Art and Architecture, Gurgaon is a week-long carnival of exhibitions, installations, discussions, workshops and lectures. It will provide a forum for engaging with policy makers and scholars who shape the thinking and vision of government and other strategic agencies. The vision is to provide a common platform for architects, planners, policy makers as well as the wider community from Indian and international cities to share insights of effective policies, schemes and projects.

The theme for IPAC this year is The Third Eye - exploring ways of seeing, seeing beyond the physical, seeing with and through intuition. The Third Eye speaks of peripheral vision, or gut feeling, leading to a meta focus. Here is our field, where the creative blurs edges and forms, where focus doesn't necessarily mean a sharper vision but a process that allows 'seeing as the point of both. This is the beginning and end of all: a form of prayer, a deeper reflection leading to insights contested but steered by an unquestioning faith in the life force. IPAC 2019, linking Architecture, Planning and Design disciplines, is structured to mirror the dance of this life force through its cycle of creation/preservation/ destruction. And rebirth.

IPAC 2019 aimed to bring together architects, artists, writers and other pioneers of the field and expose the student body to a wider spectrum of thinking. This conclave was a week long culmination of workshops, panel discussions, lectures and exhibitions that provided a forum for engaging and interacting amongst the students and professionals at the top of their respective fields.

Revitalization of a Walled City Case - Udaipur

Udaipur - 'The City of Lakes' or 'The Venice of East' is famed for its enthralling environment and royal history. With its picturesque landscape, lakes, and historic significance, Udaipur has emerged to be a prominent destination for tourists visiting Rajasthan. Increase of tourist traffic and poor public infrastructure in Udaipur, along with rise in commercial activities and expansion of hotels within the Walled City area has led to air pollution and degradation of environment.

Research Aim

Research Objectives

Scope & Limitation

- The study area is concentrated on the Walled City of Udaipur & focus on heritage, land use, tourism, and socio-economic factors.
- The study primarily focuses on transport infrastructure, while other infrastructure components such as water supply, sewage and electricity have not been taken into consideration.

Cities are the physical manifestation of socio-economic activities, needs, aspirations and the political action of people who live there. In the natural process, with time, people multiply and grow and so the population of settlement increases. Walled city or the city core generally provides a strong network and convenient relationship between workplace (commerce or household industry) and residence and also among various work-related activities. Since most of the services are available within a small area within the walled cities, there is a mixed-use pattern that emerges as convenience in some cases and generates conflicts in others, especially when the uses are not compatible and causing congestion and delays on an everyday basis.

With its picturesque landscapes, lakes, and historic significance, Udaipur is a major destination for tourists visiting Rajasthan. Rise of tourism has also adversely impacted the city. Increase in traffic congestion and poor public infrastructure in Udaipur, primarily contributing to surge in commercial activities and constant expansion of the hospitality industry within the old city core, leads to air pollution and degradation of environment. Therefore, revitalization of the 'Walled City' will not only promote heritage conservation but also give a strong boost to tourism and consequent economic upliftment of the local population.
