To engage students and implement their observations, ideas and suggestions about the neighbourhood of Gurgaon. This will help them to understand the community and promoting inclusive development plan.

The aim of the studio exercise of M. Plan, 2019 is to explore a strategy for the urban regeneration of the neighbourhood area. This research study aims to explore and draft a strategy for a sustainable design and regeneration of Sector 56, Gurgaon. The objective of this course is to impart training in neighbourhood planning. Neighbourhood is an area within which residents share the common facilities and services, social and cultural activities required in the vicinity of the house. Although the concept of a neighbourhood depends on matters of physical arrangements, it has social implications, in that it aims at promoting the conscious participation of residents in community activities.

10. Summary of the proceeding:

The conception of the Neighbourhood unit aimed to enhance the interaction & communication among locals, through the creation of places and spaces at which people could have an eye to eye interaction. The basic structure of the





neighbourhood is with centralized spaces for recreation, to enhance the interaction. For example, the location of the school as a basis for the size of the neighbourhood, and within a walking distance, aimed to encourage walking hence parents would interact as they took their kids to and from school.

The planning concept and the design of this neighbourhood development, the environment should be respected to bring nature into the neighbourhood, to significantly improve the quality of life. The growth focuses on land use from a planning and transportation perspective. It intensifies growth in dense walkable urban downtown areas to avoid sprawl. The future of growth must be well planned and designed to create liveable urban centres that foster a sense of place and community and encourage active and healthy living.

11. Outcome:

In order to create an understanding of Neighbourhood concept, a detailed literature survey for the concept and its applications on Sector 56, Gurgaon has been undertaken. The capacity of the students is very small, however they tried to focus firstly on city level & properties of residential areas within Sector 56, Gurgaon. The students worked for clear understanding of population density and its importance while planning residential neighbourhoods, as well as focused on the basic skills of planning.

Off Campus Independent Study (OCIS) is a credit based course in 2nd and 3rd year of Bachelor of Architecture Programme. OCIS, which is generally scheduled between the Odd and Even Semesters, is linked primarily with Architecture Design and Building Construction courses in order to prepare students for a more coherent architecture study. The 3rd year Architecture Design studio engages students in understanding and developing habitats that are responding to the contextual ecologies and prevent environmental risks. This is addressed by developing a prototype and analysing its parameters to create a habitat that would protect the ecology and/or environment from potential damages or altercations. This oftentime leads to modern and futuristic designs bearing in mind the ground reality and the studio is called R.E.A.L -Responsive Ecologies Architecture Lab. A total of 58 third year students, in the beginning of 2024, had visited Seoul, South Korea and Gurgaon to understand and document the modern and futuristic architecture of the city as a case-study for their 6th Semester Design Studio. The theme of the OCIS " Architecture as Machine " was in alignment with the studio premise and the trip was scheduled for 7D/6N from 9th January till 16th January. The students got the first hand experience of visiting the structures designed by renowned architects such as Zaha Hadid, Tadao Ando, Mario Botta, Rem Koolhaas, and Eui-Sung Yi of Morphosis.

Khirki Mosque

Khirki Mosque, approached from the Khirki Village in South Delhi and close to the Satpula or the seven arched bridge on the edge of southern wall of Jahanpanah (the fourth city of Medieval Delhi), was a mosque built by Khan-I-Jahan Junan Shah, the prime minister of Firoz Shah Tughlaq (1351–1388) of the Tughlaq Dynasty. The word 'Khirki' prefixed to mosque is an Urdu word that means "window" and hence is also called "The Mosque of Windows".

Architecture

The Mosque has a 52 m (170.6 ft) x52 m (170.6 ft) square plan in an area of 87 m2 (936.5 sq. ft). It is raised on a plinth of 3 m (9.8 ft). There are four open courtyards (square in size of 9.14 m (30.0 ft) on each side) encircled by arcades built with 180 square structural columns and 60 pilasters, which run in north-south direction and divides into aisles. The open courtyards are the source of light and ventilation to the internal prayer spaces. The roof is partitioned into 25 squares of equal size with 9 small domes in each square (totalling to 81 domes) and alternated by 12 flat roofs to cover the roof. The four courtyards provide light and ventilation. The four corners of the mosque are adorned with towers with three protruding gateways, one in the middle of each face, with tapering turrets flanking each gate. The southern gate, with imposing steps at the main entrance, exhibits a combination of arch and trabeated construction. It has an ornamental rectilinear frame. The turrets flanking the southern and northern gates are circular in shape; the articulation on these gives them a three storied appearance. The main gate, which leads to the qibla on the western wall, has a projecting mihrab. Above the vaulted first floor cells, ubiquitous arch windows (carved out of stone guard) with perforated screens or jalis or tracery, known as "Khirkis", are seen on the second floor.[5] However, the foyer in front of the mihrab is not well lighted since light from the latticed windows on the second floor do not penetrate this space. The approach to the roof of the mosque is from the east gate, and the view from the roof leaves a lasting impression of the geometrical design of the Mosque.[6] The mosque's walls are of rubble masonry construction with plastered surface on the outside. The interior walls are bland but provided with traditional carved stone screens. The symmetrically designed admirable mosque is considered one of "the finest architectural compositions of the Sultanate history." It was considered Firoz Shah's architectural benefaction.[4] The importance of the Khirki Mosque's architectural elegance has been considered a precursor to the intensely metaphorical Mughal architecture (1526-1857), with the Lodhi period's (1451–1526) architecture - the Delhi Sultanate's last dynasty - marking the transition.

Restoration

Over the years, a few domes on the north—east side of the mosque have collapsed and a few walls are in a dilapidated condition. The roof is on the verge of collapse at many places. Delhi chapter of Indian National Trust for Art and Cultural Heritage (INTACH) has categorized the monument as "Grade A" in terms of archaeological value. It is one of the 43 monuments identified by the Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) for restoration before the 2010 Commonwealth Games. Some conservation works have been initiated by ASI inside the mosque. Heritage experts of Delhi were concerned by the status of the restoration works of the Khirki Mosque done by the ASI, which converted it into a pink monument (pictured) as distinct from the lime mortar work done in the ancient times. They pressed the ASI to re—examine the restoration procedures adopted by them for conservation works of Mughal monuments. ASI suspended the restoration works of the Mosque and held a workshop on "Use of lime mortar in ancient times" to educate their staff on proper restoration of Mughal monuments.

A conservationist commented that

Lime mortar survives for years but needs to be carefully prepared by using all the required ingredients in correct amount. However, to bypass the lengthy but necessary method, workers then changed the traditional mixing process – followed the world over and for centuries – to 50% lime mixed with 50% brick dust and not sand. This altered the chemical and physical properties and also made it more expensive exercise (brick dust costs more than sand).

The well-established correct method of preparing a lime—surkhi mortar for conservation in the monuments, in the past, involved initially burning of lime in a kiln, then slaking it under water for a month and thereafter grinding it in a mortar mill in the proportion of 33% lime, 66% sand and other additives.

An ASI official conceded that Lime–surkhi was not used in proper proportion resulting in pink–coloured marks on some structures. ASI has now decided that in new restoration works, such as the Khirki Mosque, lime will be used in proper quantity.


Students Outcome/ Learning from Site Visit (Khirki Mosque)

- · Built with rubble stone, the Khirki Mosque is double-storeyed.
- The lower storey consists only of a series of basement cells.
- Untidy bastions occupy its four corners, imparting it the look of a fortified building.
- The gateways of three sides, except on the west, are edged by narrowed minarets; the main entrance is from the east.
- Corresponding with the openings of cells on the lower storey, the upper storey contains holed windows (khirkis), which have given it its present name.
- The pillared courtyard is divided into twenty five squares, five on each side, each square consisting of nine smaller squares.
- The larger squares, together with the square in the centre of the courtyard, are each covered with a cluster of nine small low domes.

- Among the remaining squares, four on the diagonals are left uncovered to admit light, while the others are covered with flat roofs.
- This ingenious way of covering the courtyard is repeated only in one other mosque erected by the same builder. These two are the only examples of closed mosques in northern India.
- Less activity in terms of tourism.
- Less maintenance.
- People are not aware with the structure history.

REPORT ON VISIT TO PVR IN SECTOR-80, GURGAON

VARIOUS CONSTRUCTION AND SERVICE ELEMENTS WERE STUDIED AND UNDERSTOOD FOLLOWING THE VISIT, HOW A THEATRE AND OTHER AREAS ARE DESIGNED AND CONSTRUCTED WERE SEEN, IT WAS VERY ENRICHING LERANINF EXPERIENCE.

A box office or ticket office is a place where tickets are sold to the public for admission to an event. Patrons may perform the transaction at a countertop, through a hole in a wall or window, or at a wicket. The box for the PVR was wide and spacious, it is proposed to build with advanced technology like touched screen tablets.

ABOUT FIRE EXITS AND SAFETY-

A standard size for a fire exit staircase would be at least 44 inches (1.1 meters) wide, with a minimum headroom clearance of 80 inches (2 meters) and a maximum riser height of 7 inches (18 centimetres) per step. It is also important to ensure that the staircase is easily accessible and well-lit in case of emergency. The railing of the fire exit staircase is fixed parallel to it so that while running or escaping, no one's feet get stuck in it and no one falls. The door of a fire exit staircase always opens in the direction in which people escape. Emergency signs always glow in the dark so that if there is a power cut and it becomes dark, it can be easily seen. A vision panel is always provided in the fire exit door so that in case the door is locked, the person can be seen and saved.

WASHROOMS-

At the end of the lobby, there were washrooms available for guests. Separate washrooms were designated for men and women, and there was also an accessible toilet for those with special needs. The flooring was made of marble, while the walls were covered with tiles, creating a modern look when completed.

KIOSK-

Beside Auditorium 1, there is snack kiosk from where people order snacks in the movie interval. The snacks kiosk is based on the two sides. This is because of the shortage of space; some kiosk counters were shifted to the other side. These kiosks are one level upper than the floor because the pipelines of water and beverages were passed through that level. These kiosks were designed in such a way that it will be easy for the guests to order snacks while watching movie.

AUDITORIUM:


The auditorium can accommodate 104 people in its entirety.

- 1) The theatre is completely dark; therefore, foot lighting is provided to help guests find their seats.
- 2) Gypsum board is used in a few spots and acoustic tiles cover the majority of the ceiling.
- 3) The mild steel framework used for the walls is covered in chicken mesh and glass wool (a non-flammable material), and it is then upholstered, which also cancels noise.
- 4) In case of an accident, there are also provided fire extinguishers and fire escapes.

LOBBY:

PVR Cinemas is known for its modern and stylish interior design, especially in the lobby area.

It is used in a combination of white marble and black granite with a golden stream in between, the warm lighting with chandeliers to make it a luxurious decor and to create an inviting and comfortable atmosphere in appeal. It is also provided with two food counters to enjoy in the movie break and the walls are of bookshelf pattern which will provide different posters with several lighting and on the same time will give parallel look from the sides

Products offered may include rosewood and sandalwood carvings, embellished camel hide footwear, sophisticated fabric and drapery, gems, beads, brasswear, metal crafts, and silk & wool fabrics. A number of shows promoting handicrafts and handlooms are held at the exhibition hall in the complex. To sell wares, there is an application process; spaces are allocated according to which state the seller is from.








Visit to Furniture Factory











Visit to Jawahar Kala Kendra



This visit was organised with help from eminent interior designer Seetu Kohli who also accompanied the students for explaining the artwork.



ABOUT: Jahaz Mahal in Mehrauli, Delhi, is the real definition of extraordinary beauty, which serves as one of the best places to visit. It is situated in the Mehrauli area; Delhi is one of the magnificent monuments which features some of the fantastic engineering and outstanding architecture. The palace was built in-between the years **1453** and **1525** and is also known as 'Sarai' in the bygone times. The magnificent architecture of Jahaz Mahal occupies an effective expense in the Mehrauli, Delhi. The palace was constructed during the reign of the Lodi dynasty; Jahaz Mahal palace displays minute detailing as well as delicate Islamic art.

The palace in the Mehrauli area was mainly constructed to provide an accommodation facility to the travellers and pilgrims flocking to Delhi from places like **Turkey**, **Iraq**, **Iran**, **Morocco**, **and Arab**. The term Jahaz Mahal refers to "**Ship Palace**," and this beautiful name is highly inspired by the placement of the monument near a lake named as known as Hauz-i-Shamsi. Moreover, it is also known that the real reason behind the **construction of the Jahaz Mahal** was for creating a comfortable and beautiful summer resort for the royal Mughal rulers as well as their families.

HISTORY: Jahaz Mahal in Mehrauli was constructed around 200 years later during the Lodi period. Due to its reflection on the vast lake, it gets a ship-like appearance, and hence it was named Jahaz Mahal. The huge Hauz – i – Shamsi Lake, which is located next to the Jahaz Mahal Delhi, is an exciting mix of history as well as legend. It is believed that the Prophet had arrived in the dream of ILTUTMISH and mentioned about the suggestible site of the historical tank. After that, Iltutmish visited the place and found the hoof marks of the horse, which was of the Prophet. Iltutmish had the tank dug; also, in the centre of the tank, he made a dome housing the stone with the footmarks of the Prophet's horse. The chain traveller Iban Battuta was struck by the enormity of the tank.

In today's time, the tank is a shadow of the past, and probably it has also reduced in size; the water looks dirty. The domed structure approached by a particular passage is perhaps a continued version of the one original one created by Iltutmish.

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
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

The historic neighbourhood of Delhi, the Mughal Period Jharna is a prominent water structure dating back to 1700 AD. Built by Nawab Ghazi Uddin, it was designed to be a pleasure garden and a retreat for the Mughals.

The Jharna, which means a waterfall, received the extra runoff from the Hauz--Shamsi (vast Slave dynasty tank) through an underground pipe, which is still visible today. Built in three parts, its complete structure consisted of a reservoir, a waterfall and a slew of fountains.

Known to host the famous 'Phool Walon ki Sair' (Procession of Florists) since the Mughal era, the Jharna is also used as a venue for other events like the Basant Utsav (Spring Festival) and the Monsoon Festival.

Jharna, a fine-looking garden with cascades and fountains built by Firuz Shah Tughluq is located near Hauz-I-Shamshi at Mehrauli in new Delhi. The jharna takes care of the excess water that flows from the Hauz-I-Shamshi after the monsoon. The well-known festival Phool Walo ki sair which is held every year begins from this jharna. The word meaning of Jharna is waterfall.

Primary colors are applied to the surfaces, echoing the simplicity of the craft and the texture is intentionally left raw, allowing visitors to touch and feel the paper, connecting them more deeply with the craft.


Key Concepts: The speaker began her talk by emphasizing the fundamental principles of Universal Design.

- 6. **Simple and Intuitive Design**: Aim for simplicity and clarity in design elements and layouts to make it easy for users to understand and navigate the space without the need for complex instructions or assistance.
- 7. **Inclusive Amenities**: Provide amenities that cater to a diverse range of users, such as accessible restrooms, seating options with armrests for support, and designated quiet areas for individuals who may need a break from sensory stimulation.

Minimize unnecessary noise and distractions, use adjustable lighting to accommodate different preferences, and incorporate tactile elements for wayfinding.

Importance of Universal Design: Throughout her presentation, Ms. Ruchira underscored the importance of Universal Design in various domains, including architecture, product design, transportation, and information technology. She elucidated how Universal Design not only benefits individuals with disabilities but also enhances usability and convenience for everyone. For instance, curb cuts, initially designed for wheelchair users, now benefit parents with strollers, travelers with luggage, and cyclists. Similarly, captions intended for the deaf and hard of hearing improve comprehension for viewers in noisy environments or non-native speakers.

Furthermore, the speaker emphasized the economic and social benefits of Universal Design. By catering to diverse user needs from the outset, organizations can reduce the need for retrofits and accommodate a broader customer base, thus fostering inclusivity and maximizing market reach.

Conclusion: In conclusion, Ruchira Sarin's talk on Universal Design provided a comprehensive understanding of its principles and significance in creating inclusive environments. By adhering to Universal Design principles, designers and policymakers can ensure that their creations are accessible, usable, and enjoyable for all individuals, regardless of their abilities or backgrounds. In conclusion, we express our gratitude to Mr. Nazmul for sharing his knowledge and experience with us. This visit was an incredibly valuable learning experience for all of us.





Radiology Department Visit at W Pratiksha Hospital, Sector 56, Gurugram, Haryana Summary: On the 14th of October 2021, a hospital visit was organized by Sushant University to the Radiology Department of W Pratiksha Hospital. The purpose of the visit was to provide the students with a practical understanding of the radiology departments operations and to enhance their knowledge in the field. The visit proved to be an informative and enriching experience for all the participants. The visit began with a warm welcome from the hospital staff, who guided the students to the Radiology Department. The department head, Dr. Sharma, introduced himself and shared his expertise in the field of radiology. Dr. Sharma gave a general review of the functions and role of the radiology department in patient care at the beginning of the session. - 3. Refraction Tests: Those with abnormal visual acuity results underwent refraction tests to determine the appropriate prescription for corrective eyeglasses, if needed.




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

The Department of Pharmacy (School of Health Sciences) organized a Herbal Garden visit to Amrit Udyan, Rashtrapati Bhawan, Delhi, on22nd February, 2024. The Amrit Udayan is called the soul' of the Presidential Palace and is open to the public every spring. A visit was organized to the Amrit Udvan, which intended to create a representation of an earthly utopia in which humans co-exist in perfect harmony with all elements of nature. Some of the typical features include pools and fountains inside the gardens. They also saw specially cultivated tulips of 12 unique varieties, which are expected to bloom in phases, as well as 120 varieties of roses and a variety of hyacinths, marigolds, dahlias, and other flowers. The highlight of the garden is a 200-yearold Sheesham tree. There were QR codes placed in the garden next to each variety of plant, which were scanned by the educator to get more information about any particular flower, plant, or tree and discussed with students. This luxurious garden is divided into three sections, namely the Pearl Garden, Butterfly Garden, and Circular Garden. The entire garden space consists of the rarest species of flowers, and the greenery is so lush that one cannot take their eyes off the complex. The students observed that the garden is divided into 36 squares by a grid of water channels and paths. The students thoroughly enjoyed the visit to the sprawling 15 acres of greenery featuring herbal plants, medicinal plants, decades-old bonsais, and patches full of fresh blooms in myriad colors and varieties.

The **objective** of this visit is to create awareness of the conservation and traditional uses of herbs and medicinal plants. It was a rejuvenating and informative experience where the students got a chance to appreciate and admire nature's wonders.

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




