Academic Year 2019-20 to 2023-24





### 2015-2016: BA LLB(H)

- The feedback received from the students was above average. The students seemed to be satisfied with the course scheme in the school.
- The feedback in general from the teachers and employers in general was that the school is gradually improving, and periodical review should be done.
- There was a specific suggestion also with respect to removal of Foreign language as well as it has no relevance for the law students.

### 2016-2017: BA LLB(H)

- The feedback received from the students was satisfactory.
- The feedback received from industry experts was also satisfactory and one of the major things pointed out by them was that Advocacy skills is not required as a separate subject as we already have mooting exercise and internship. This, subject teaches advocacy skills to the students.
- There was also a suggestion of some of them to start BBA LLB(H) program as well.

### 2017-2018: BA/BBA LLB(H)

- There was a demand from the students that they need specialized courses as are being taught in other colleges in Delhi NCR.
- This demand of the students was also the same from the side of the experts as well.
   Even the industry experts and teachers were of the view that students need to study diversified subjects.

### 2018-2019: BA/BBA LLB(H)

- The students as well as the industry experts had the same opinion that certain upcoming field of law can also be included in the course curriculum.
- Suggestions with respect to contemporary issues of law like clean energy and sustainability, international commercial arbitration, etc should be taught to the students.
- There was also a suggestion made by some advocates to introduce 3-year LLB(H) as a program.

### 2019-2020: BA/BBA LLB(H)

- The suggestion with respect to introduction of 3-year LLB(H) was reiterated.
- The teachers as well as the industry experts seemed satisfied with course curriculum.
