


Fig 1 : School children

The United Nations designated 5 June as World Environment Day to highlight that the protection and health of the environment is a major issue, which affects the well-being of peoples and economic development throughout the world. The celebration of this day provides us with an opportunity to broaden the basis for an enlightened opinion and responsible conduct by individuals, enterprises and communities in preserving and enhancing the environment. World Environment Day is a global platform for inspiring positive change. People from more than 150 countries participate in this United Nations international day, which celebrates environmental action and the power of governments, businesses and individuals to create a more sustainable world. World Environment Day puts a global spotlight on the pressing environmental challenges of our times. This UN international day has become the largest global platform for environmental outreach, with millions of people from across the world engaging to protect the planet.

The focus was Ecosystem Restoration celebrated under the theme "Reimagine. Recreate. Restore", it cast a spotlight on how humanity has been exploiting the planet's ecosystems and called for a concerted global effort to repair the damage that has been done. Every three seconds, the world loses enough forest to cover a football pitch and, over the last century, half of all wetlands have been destroyed.

Ecosystem restoration means assisting in the recovery of ecosystems that have been degraded or destroyed, as well as conserving the ecosystems that are still intact. Healthier ecosystems, with richer biodiversity, yield greater benefits such as more fertile soils, bigger yields of timber and fish, and larger stores of greenhouse gases.

Restoration can happen in many ways – for example through actively planting or by removing pressures so that nature can recover on its own. It is not always possible – or desirable – to return an ecosystem to its original state. We still need farmland and infrastructure on land that was once forest, for instance, and ecosystems, like societies, need to adapt to a changing climate.

Between now and 2030, the restoration of 350 million hectares of degraded terrestrial and aquatic ecosystems could generate US\$9 trillion in ecosystem services. Restoration could also remove 13 to 26 gigatons of greenhouse gases from the atmosphere. The economic benefits of such interventions exceed nine times the cost of investment, whereas inaction is at least three times more costly than ecosystem restoration.

Every three seconds, the world loses enough forest to cover a footby pitch and over the last century, we have destroyed half of our wetlands. As much as 50 per cent of our coral reefs have already UNIV.

been lost and up to 90 per cent of coral reefs could be lost by 2050, even if global warming is limited to an increase of 1.5°C. COVID-19 emergence and spread has highlighted how shrinking the area of natural habitat for animals, can create ideal conditions for pathogens – including coronaviruses – to spread. Hence the theme of ecosystem restoration was chosen.





Workshop on hands on training on HPLC was organized by the Department of Pharmacy under in collaboration with Ram Swaroop Memorial University 29 July 2023. The session was carried out by technical experts Dr Basavaraj H C, Dr. Chandrashekar and Ms. Shreyas Burji from Auxochromofours solutions Pvt Ltd The workshop started with the brief introduction by Dr Chandrashekar wherein they introduced the students with the basics of HPLC and showed video's related to working of HPLC. The



workshop was attended by all the Health Sciences students.

After the basic introduction to HPLC students were divided in two where the 1st batch went for working in lab. The students learnt how to make standard solution and sample solution using deflazacort (i.e. crude and test sample). Then they prepared mobile phase using acronitrile: water in 80: 20. Then the students were taught how to inject sample near sample port and how to work with the LC solution software. Then analysis of the chromatogram after individual sample injection was carried out. The 2 nd batch was in an auditorium where they understood about basics of analytical techniques (spectrophotometry, chromatography), introduction to chromatography and types of chromatography. Then the batches were interchanged and 2nd batch was given on hands training of the HPLC.




Fig 2: Walking along the trail

Brief Description (min 250 to max 800 words)*

In an attempt to start a conversation around mental health, the 1st year students from the Department of Psychology, School of Health Sciencecreated an eye opening Nukkad Natak that delved into the life of a depressed boy. The storyline resonated with many because it depicted the realities faced by today's youth. It highlighted the significance of expert intervention which is required to treat mental health issues, and addressing the stigma surrounding psychological illnesses. The narrative revolved round a younger guy grappling with depression, pressured by his parents, career and relationships. While initially his family's tries to discover an answer through conservative meansby consulting a baba, they soon find that consulting a mental health profession is the best way to treat mental health problems. Throughout the performance, the audience was immersed into the protagonist's journey, witnessing the inner struggles and societal pressures that frequently accompany mental health problems. By portraying the protagonist's reluctance to seek professional help and then eventually finding relief though professional psychological therapy, the message that psychological problems are no longer a reason to feel shame was emphasized. To sum up, the Nukkad Natak helped to raise awareness of mental health, challenging preconceived notions,

and promoting acceptance and support for people living with mental health conditions. Through the power of storytelling, the students connected with the audience, moved their minds, and encouraged them to take action to break the taboo around mental health.

Outcome*	The street play was a way to raise awareness, about health issues specifically focusing on depression. With a storyline the audience was drawn into the life of a boy dealing with depression. The performance highlighted the challenges faced by the character including misunderstandings within his family struggles in relationships and unsuccessful attempts to seek help. By portraying the journey of this boy seeking assistance from sources such as a spiritual guru recommended by his aunt and eventually a psychologist, the street play emphasized the importance of professional intervention and reducing stigma around mental health treatment. Spectators were encouraged to reflect on the significance of recognizing and addressing health problems with sensitivity and understanding. Additionally the interactive nature of the performance allowed engagement with the audience sparking conversations and fostering a sense of community awareness. Viewers were prompted to contemplate how common mental health struggles are in society and recognize the need for compassion and support, for those facing challenges. Ultimately besides raising awareness this street play also advocated for empathy, understanding and seeking help when dealing with health difficulties. The event was a reminder of how crucial it's to reduce the stigma surrounding mental health issues and create a supportive environment, for individuals struggling with their mental well being.



School of Business, Sushant University has successfully organized a guest lecture on "Choosing the Right Path for Higher Education" by subject expert, Dr. Mukul, on 20th February 2024.

The objective of the lecture was to educate students on the different higher education options available, to help students understand the criteria for selecting the right course and institution, to provide guidance on application procedures, scholarships, and entrance exams and to connect students with resources and mentors for personalized advice.

The workshop content included the overview of higher education paths (e.g., Master's, Ph.D., professional courses), types of institutions (e.g., universities, colleges, online education platforms). The key factors in choosing a course and institution (e.g., location, faculty, infrastructure, curriculum), importance of accreditation and rankings, balancing personal interests with market demand. The students were also guided on detailed steps for applying to institutions (e.g., application forms, deadlines), overview of common entrance exams (e.g., GRE, GMAT, GATE, CAT) and were also given certain tips for preparing for entrance exams and interviews.

The methodology used for the guest lecture was the instructional approach that is the combination of lectures, demonstrations, and hands-on practice sessions. Handouts on higher education options, detailed guides on application processes, lists of scholarships and financial aid resources, and entrance exam preparation materials. were provided to the participants. The purpose of the guest lecture was to help the participants to gain a clear understanding of how to select the right course and institution for higher education, improved preparedness, and personalized guidance.

The Higher Education Guidance lecture successfully provided students with the necessary information and tools to make informed decisions about their higher education paths. The positive feedback and high level of engagement indicate the effectiveness of the workshop. Future workshops could include more specialized sessions based on student interest and feedback.

World Glaucoma Day is celebrated, a collaborative project between World Glaucoma Association and World Glaucoma Patient Association. The aim of the project is to help eliminate blindness caused by this disease by raising awareness and alerting on the need of having regular eye check-ups in which the optic nerve is examined. Department of Optometry, SHS Sushant University, in collaboration with Dr. Shraddha Yadav, MBBS, DNB (Ophthal), Cornea & Refractive Surgeon at Ahooja Eye & Dental Institute, and Mr. Sunil Dixit, Optometry Incharge at AEDI.

Objective: To raise awareness about glaucoma, the 'Silent thief of Sight', in commemoration of World Glaucoma Day and to facilitate early detection and prevention.

Overview: On March 13th, 2024, the Sushant Vision Care Centre at Sushant University was abuzz with activity as the Department of Optometry, in collaboration with esteemed professionals, organized a "Glaucoma Eye Screening" event. The initiative aimed to shed light on the often overlooked but debilitating eye condition of glaucoma, while providing attendees with an opportunity to undergo comprehensive eye examinations. More specifically, it is a disease that affects the optic nerve initially causing a loss of peripheral vision (in the visual field) in patients If it is not detected early on and properly treated, it may progress towards a more serious vision loss and affect central vision. Many of the glaucomas have a genetic basis and actually in most of them there is an elevation of





	the intraocular pressure that, together with other factors, causes damage to the optic nerve and provokes an early death of the nerve cells that compose it.






