## Report on Student Induction Program: Code of Conduct and Campus Etiquette


#### Health and Safety:










#### Report on Anti-Ragging






#### Report on Guidelines for Dress-Code



Attendance was mandatory, and the agenda covered key topics essential for faculty governance and academic responsibilities.



# HR Policies: Leave, Attendance, Payroll, and Code of Conduct

The session on HR policies provided a comprehensive overview of faculty rights and obligations. This included guidelines on leave management, attendance protocols, and payroll. Faculty were informed about various leave categories such as medical, casual, and earned leave, with emphasis on the importance of timely attendance and reporting. Payroll processes were detailed, ensuring faculty understand the salary structure, deductions, and the procedures for addressing any concerns. A key focus was the code of conduct, which underlined the expected standards of behavior, ethical responsibilities, and interaction with students and colleagues to maintain professionalism and uphold the values of the university.

# Academic Policies: Grading, Assessments, and Curriculum Design

The academic policies session emphasized the university's approach to grading and assessments. Faculty were briefed on the grading structure, including continuous assessments through quizzes, assignments, and the balance with final examinations. #### **Research and Publication Policies**

Faculty were encouraged to actively engage in research, publish in recognized journals, and seek collaboration with industry or other academic institutions. The process for applying for research grants and the university's support in these initiatives were discussed. # Intellectual Property and Plagiarism Guidelines

The policy outlined the rights of faculty and the university concerning patents and publications, emphasizing the need for faculty to protect their intellectual contributions. Faculty were educated on plagiarism detection tools and practices to ensure academic integrity, particularly in publications and teaching materials. The consequences of plagiarism were discussed, and faculty were encouraged to foster originality in both research and teaching.

# Anti-Discrimination and Equal Opportunity Policies

The final segment addressed anti-discrimination and equal opportunity policies, vital in promoting an inclusive and equitable workplace. The policy ensures that all faculty members are provided with equal opportunities for professional development, irrespective of gender, race, age, or other factors. Guidelines were provided on addressing discrimination or harassment issues and ensuring that grievances are handled promptly and fairly. Faculty were reminded of their responsibility to create a



supportive and inclusive learning environment for students and staff alike, reinforcing the university's commitment to diversity and equal opportunity.

On 9th September 2020, Sushant University (formerly known as Ansal University) organized a virtual session on **Anti-Ragging Awareness** for all first-year students. The session, held via Google Meet, aimed to educate students about the severe consequences of ragging, their role in its prevention, and how such behavior can damage the reputation of educational institutions. The session took place



between 2 p.m. and 4 p.m., and attendance was mandatory for all first-year students, ensuring that they were informed of the university's zero-tolerance policy towards ragging.

#### **Consequences of Ragging**

The first segment of the session focused on the **consequences of ragging**, highlighting its legal, psychological, and social implications. Students were made aware that ragging is a criminal offense in India, punishable under the Anti-Ragging Act. The legal consequences of participating in or encouraging ragging can include suspension, expulsion from the institution, and even imprisonment. The session also covered the emotional and psychological toll that ragging can have on victims, ranging from anxiety, depression, and trauma to, in extreme cases, suicidal tendencies. Faculty members emphasized that ragging is not only a violation of an individual's dignity and rights but also a severe breach of moral conduct. The presentation included real-life examples of how ragging incidents had resulted in lasting negative impacts on the lives of both victims and perpetrators, stressing that even minor participation in such activities can have life-altering consequences.

#### **Role of Students in Prevention**

The next agenda item focused on the **role of students in the prevention** of ragging. The faculty emphasized that preventing ragging is a collective responsibility, and every student has a role to play in ensuring that the campus remains a safe and inclusive space. First-year students were encouraged to report any instances of ragging immediately, either experienced personally or witnessed among their peers. The university assured students that they could report incidents anonymously and that strict action would be taken to protect their identity and safety. The role of student leaders and senior students was also highlighted as they are expected to guide and support junior students rather than engaging in harmful practices. By promoting healthy interaction and inclusion, senior students can help create a positive environment, reducing the chances of ragging. The university's various committees, including anti-ragging cells and student welfare bodies, were introduced as essential support systems for students facing difficulties.

## Effect on Institution's Reputation

The session also shed light on the effect of ragging on the institution's reputation. Faculty members explained how instances of ragging can tarnish the reputation of a university, affecting not only current students but also beture applicants, faculty, and partnerships with external organizations. A single ragging incident can lead to negative media coverage, legal battles, and a decline in trust among parents, students, and stakeholders. Universities that are known for ragging issues may struggle to attract top talent, both in terms of students and faculty, and may face difficulties in securing academic and corporate collaborations. The long-term impact can result in reduced enrollment, financial losses, and a damaged reputation that takes years to rebuild. Therefore, it was stressed that maintaining a ragging-free campus is crucial for the overall prestige and success of the university. Students were encouraged to take pride in their institution by upholding its values of respect, inclusion, and safety.

## Report on Orientation Programme 2020







Topics such as punctuality, accountability, respect for diversity, and open communication were emphasized. Faculty were encouraged to act as mentors to students and peers by demonstrating professionalism in their daily tasks, including classroom management, participation in university events, and contributing to an inclusive academic environment. The importance of upholding the university's vision and mission through collaborative work and responsible leadership was underlined.

Moreover, the Dean addressed challenges that faculty members might encounter in professional journey, such as balancing academic freedom with institutional guidelines, handling conflicts within the workplace, and managing personal and professional growth. The session provided strategies for navigating these challenges while maintaining ethical professional and standards. The faculty code of conduct was also reviewed, stressing the need for faculty members to model appropriate behavior, act as positive influencers within the university, and engage in continuous self-improvement.

Description (min 250 to max 800 words)\*

On 9th August 2022, Sushant University (formerly known as Ansal University) held its **Annual Awareness Session** on the **Code of Conduct** for all faculty and staff members. The session, which took place from 3 p.m. to 5 p.m. in room D421, focused on ensuring the responsible use of institutional technology, email, internet usage, and appropriate social media conduct. Attendance was mandatory, reflecting the importance of adhering to these guidelines in maintaining a professional and ethical work environment.



#### Responsible Use of Institutional Technology and Digital Resources

The first part of the session covered the **responsible use of institutional technology and digital resources**. Faculty and staff were reminded of the significant role technology plays in the daily operations of the university, from handling academic records and communication to research and administrative tasks. Attendees were encouraged to use these resources efficiently and ethically, following the guidelines set by the university to protect data security and privacy.

The session addressed the importance of using university-provided technology strictly for work-related purposes. Faculty and staff were informed about the risks of unauthorized access to sensitive data and the potential for data breaches if these technologies are misused. Proper handling of student information, research data, and other institutional materials was emphasized. Faculty were reminded to ensure that student records are securely stored and that digital tools are used appropriately to manage academic tasks such as grading, feedback, and communication.

Furthermore, the session emphasized the importance of regularly updating passwords, being cautious about phishing scams, and refraining from downloading unauthorized software or applications that could compromise the university's digital infrastructure. IT personnel were available to answer any questions related to the safe use of institutional technology, offering practical advice on how to protect personal and institutional data.

#### **Email and Internet Usage Guidelines**

The next segment focused on **email and internet usage guidelines**. The university stressed the significance of professional communication through institutional email, urging faculty and staff to maintain a formal tone when corresponding with students, colleagues, and external stakeholders. Guidelines were provided on how to compose professional emails, including the appropriate use of language, clarity, and the importance of timely responses.

The session also highlighted the risks associated with using the university's internet services for personal purposes. Faculty and staff were reminded that browsing non-work-related websites or engaging in inappropriate online activities could not only violate university policies but also pose security risks to the institution's network. The misuse of the internet during working hours was discouraged, with the university stressing the need to remain focused on professional responsibilities.

Additionally, the university reiterated that all online communication and activities, whether through email or internet browsing, should comply with legal and ethical standards. Faculty and staff were informed that internet usage is monitored to ensure compliance with institutional policies, and any violations could result in disciplinary action.

#### Social Media Conduct: Personal vs. Professional Boundaries

The final part of the session discussed **social media conduct** and the fine line between personal and professional boundaries. In today's digital age, social media platforms play a large role in both personal and professional lives. However, the university emphasized the importance of maintaining a distinction between the two, particularly for faculty and staff who are in leadership or mentorship roles.

The session provided guidance on how to manage personal social media accounts responsibly while upholding the university's reputation. Faculty and staff were reminded to avoid sharing sensitive or confidential information related to the university on public platforms. It was stressed that even



personal opinions shared on social media could be perceived as representative of the university if they are not clearly distinguished as private views.

In terms of professional boundaries, faculty were advised to be cautious about engaging with students on social media. The university encouraged keeping interactions professional and suggested using institutional platforms like emails or designated learning management systems for communication with students. Faculty and staff were also reminded to be mindful of the content they post and the potential impact it could have on their professional image and relationships within the university community.

The session also addressed the growing need for faculty and staff to act as ambassadors of the university's values online. Maintaining integrity, respect, and professionalism in online spaces was emphasized as essential to upholding the institution's image and fostering a positive academic environment.



#### Description (min 250 to max 800 words)\*

The Examination Cell of the Department at Sushant University organized a session on Academic Structures and Policies for all first-year students on 11th August 2022, held in room D421. Attendance was mandatory, ensuring that all students were present to gain an understanding of the key academic guidelines, systems, and expectations that will govern their studies at the university. The session was crucial in helping students transition smoothly into university life by familiarizing them with the academic framework.

#### Introduction to Academic Programmes, Courses, and Curriculum

The session began with an introduction to the various academic programmes offered at Sushant University. Students were provided with an overview of their specific courses and the curriculum structure, including core subjects, electives, and co-curricular activities. The importance of understanding the course outlines, learning objectives, and expected outcomes was emphasized, enabling students to plan their academic journey efficiently. Each programme was designed to ensure a balance between theoretical knowledge and practical application, preparing students for industry standards and future career opportunities. Faculty members encouraged students to take an active role in their learning, engage with the curriculum fully, and make the most of the university's resources.

#### Academic Calendar, Timetables, and Schedules

Students were also introduced to the academic calendar, which outlines key dates and deadlines for the entire academic year. The calendar includes important events such as semester start and end dates, exam periods, holidays, and breaks. Understanding this calendar is crucial for students to manage their time effectively and meet academic deadlines. Additionally, the timetable structure for classes was explained in detail, ensuring students are aware of their weekly schedules. Students were



advised to stay updated with any changes to the timetable through official university communication channels. The clarity on how academic schedules function was aimed at promoting punctuality and organizational skills among the students.

#### **Grading System and Evaluation Methods**

A significant part of the session was dedicated to explaining the **grading system** and methods of evaluation. Students were informed about the grading scale used at the university, which consists of letter grades associated with specific grade points. The session also covered the different types of assessments that will be used to evaluate student performance, such as quizzes, assignments, presentations, mid-semester tests, and final exams. Faculty emphasized the importance of continuous assessment, which contributes to a significant portion of the final grade. The objective was to make students understand that performance throughout the semester is as important as the final examination. Transparency in the evaluation process was discussed, ensuring students know the weightage of each component and how their overall performance will be measured.

#### **Attendance and Discipline Policies**

The final section of the session covered attendance and discipline policies, both of which are vital for academic success. Attendance is considered an important aspect of student discipline at Sushant University, and students were informed about the minimum attendance requirement that must be met to be eligible for exams. The importance of maintaining consistent attendance was stressed, as regular participation in classes is essential for understanding the material and performing well in assessments. In addition to attendance, students were briefed on the disciplinary policies of the university, including expectations regarding classroom behavior, submission deadlines, and academic honesty. Consequences for failing to meet attendance or disciplinary standards were clearly outlined, ensuring that students understand the importance of adhering to university guidelines.

#### Description (min 250 to max 800 words)\*

On 19th August 2022, Sushant University organized a session titled **Administrative Efficiency and Skill Development** for all faculty and staff members. The session, held from 10 a.m. to 12 noon in room D421, aimed to enhance the administrative skills of the university's personnel, ensuring that they are better equipped to handle their roles and responsibilities. Attendance was mandatory, emphasizing the importance of the event for improving institutional efficiency and the well-being of the staff. The session focused on three key areas: the use of administrative software, effective record keeping, and stress management.

#### **Using Administrative Software**

The session began with an in-depth discussion on the **use of administrative software**, a crucial tool for streamlining university operations. Faculty and staff were introduced to the latest software systems being implemented at the university, designed to handle everything from student records and grading to payroll and leave management. The goal of this segment was to familiarize attendees with the tools that can automate repetitive tasks, reduce manual errors, and improve the overall efficiency of administrative processes. The university's IT team provided a demonstration of how to use these systems effectively, explaining key features such as data entry, reporting, and communication functionalities.

The use of administrative software is essential in today's educational institutions, allowing for smoother operations, faster access to information, and better coordination between departments. The training emphasized that by adopting these technologies, staff and faculty members could significantly reduce paperwork and focus more on their core responsibilities, such as teaching and student engagement.

#### Effective Record Keeping

The next topic of discussion was **effective record keeping**, which is an essential skill for ensuring the smooth functioning of any academic institution. The session highlighted the importance of maintaining accurate, organized, and up-to-date records for both students and faculty. Effective record keeping not only ensures compliance with university regulations and government policies but also supports better decision-making, tracking of academic performance, and resource allocation.

The university's administrative team outlined best practices for organizing both physical and digital records. This included maintaining a proper filing system, ensuring that sensitive information is protected, and regular updates of student and faculty data. Faculty members were also reminded of their responsibility in maintaining records related to student attendance, grading, and assessments, while administrative staff were trained on handling payroll, leave records, and other HR-related documents. Clear guidelines were provided on how long records should be retained and when they should be archived or disposed of securely, to avoid data breaches or loss of important information.

#### **Stress Management**

The final segment of the session focused on stress management, acknowledging that the pressures of administrative work can sometimes lead to high stress levels among faculty and staff. Managing



workload, meeting deadlines, and balancing administrative responsibilities with teaching duties can create an overwhelming environment if not handled properly.

To address this issue, the session introduced participants to various techniques for managing stress in the workplace. These included time management strategies, the importance of taking regular breaks, mindfulness exercises, and breathing techniques to alleviate anxiety. Faculty and staff were encouraged to prioritize tasks effectively, delegate responsibilities when necessary, and avoid burnout by maintaining a healthy work-life balance. The importance of recognizing early signs of stress and tolaing proactive steps to manage it was emphasized, alongside the university's commitment to providing mental health support and counselling services to employees who may be struggling.



# Description (min 250 to max 800 words)\*

On 8th September 2022, Sushant University (formerly known as Ansal University) organized an **Anti-Ragging Awareness** session for all students to address the growing concern of ragging and its harmful consequences on campus life. The session was held from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. in room D421, with attendance made mandatory to ensure the message reached the entire student body. The session aimed to educate students about the detrimental effects of ragging on both victims and perpetrators, highlight the institution's role in enforcing anti-ragging policies, and encourage a culture of inclusion and mutual respect among students.

# Ragging and its Impact on Victims and Perpetrators

The first part of the session focused on the **impact of ragging on both victims and perpetrators**, emphasizing that ragging is not a harmless initiation practice but a serious offense that can have lasting psychological and legal consequences. Students were informed that ragging is a criminal offense under Indian law, with strict penalties that include suspension, expulsion, and even imprisonment. Faculty members explained how ragging often results in physical, emotional, and mental trauma for victims. It can lead to anxiety, depression, social isolation, and, in extreme cases, suicidal tendencies. The harmful effects on victims can last for years, affecting their academic performance and personal growth.

On the other hand, students were also made aware of the severe consequences for those who engage in ragging. Beyond the legal ramifications, perpetrators often face social ostracism and lasting damage to their academic and professional futures. A criminal record for ragging can hinder future career opportunities, as many companies and institutions refuse to associate with individuals involved in such activities. The session conveyed that ragging dehumanizes both the victim and the perpetrator, creating a toxic culture that goes against the principles of education and personal



development.

# Role of the Institution in Enforcing Anti-Ragging Policies

The second segment of the session highlighted the role of Sushant University in enforcing antiragging policies. The university's strict stance against ragging was reiterated, with an emphasis on the measures that have been put in place to prevent ragging incidents on campus. Faculty members provided an overview of the university's anti-ragging committee, which actively monitors student behavior and ensures compliance with anti-ragging regulations.

Students were informed about the anonymous channels available for reporting any instances of ragging or harassment, with assurances that the university would take immediate and strict action against those found guilty. The administration emphasized that all students have the responsibility to uphold these policies, not only for their own protection but also to contribute to a safe and positive environment for everyone. The session stressed that prevention is a collective effort, requiring cooperation between students, faculty, and administrative staff.

# **Encouraging a Culture of Inclusion and Respect Among Students**

The final part of the session focused on **encouraging a culture of inclusion and respect among students**, as an essential element in preventing ragging. The university promotes a culture where every student, regardless of their background, is treated with dignity, respect, and kindness. Faculty members emphasized the importance of building relationships based on mutual trust and support, rather than dominance and coercion.

The session included discussions on how senior students can take an active role in welcoming and supporting new students, especially first-year students who are often more vulnerable to ragging. By fostering friendships and mentoring junior students, seniors can set a positive example and contribute to creating a welcoming atmosphere on campus. The session also encouraged students to celebrate diversity and respect individual differences in a spirit of empathy and inclusion.

On 31st August 2023, Sushant University organized a session titled **Anti-Ragging Awareness: Ragging vs Positive Interaction** for all students. Held from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. in room D421, the session aimed to educate students on the harmful effects of ragging and promote values such as respect, empathy, and integrity in their interactions. The event focused on distinguishing between ragging and positive social interactions, encouraging students to uphold ethics and dignity in their behavior. Attendance was mandatory, ensuring that all students received crucial guidance on these important issues.

# The Importance of Ethics in Student Behavior and Leadership

The session began by addressing the **importance of ethics** in student behavior and leadership. Faculty members stressed that student life is not only about academic achievements but also about developing strong moral values that shape a person's character. As future professionals and leaders, students are expected to uphold ethical standards in all aspects of life, including their interactions with peers. Ethical behavior fosters trust, respect, and a sense of community on campus.

Leadership among students was also discussed, where students were encouraged to lead by example. Leaders are expected to mentor and support their peers, particularly first-year students, to help them integrate into the campus community. Rather than engaging in harmful practices like ragging, students were reminded that ethical leadership requires kindness, patience, and understanding. By exhibiting positive behavior, they contribute to a healthy, inclusive environment that allows everyone to thrive academically and socially.



# Promoting Values of Respect, Empathy, and Integrity

The second segment of the session focused on **promoting values of respect, empathy, and integrity**. Faculty emphasized the need for students to respect one another's differences, whether based on culture, ethnicity, gender, or background. These values are essential in fostering a harmonious campus life. Empathy was highlighted as a crucial trait for building meaningful relationships among students. The importance of putting oneself in another's shoes, especially when dealing with junior students or newcomers, was discussed as a way to foster understanding and compassion rather than engaging in bullying or exclusionary practices.

# How Ragging Goes Against the Principles of Human Dignity and Equality

The final agenda item explored how ragging goes against the principles of human dignity and equality. Students were made aware that ragging is not merely a harmless tradition but a serious violation of a person's dignity and rights. Faculty members explained that every individual has the right to be treated with respect and equality, regardless of their age, experience, or background. Ragging, in any form, is an act of bullying and exploitation, stripping individuals of their dignity and potentially causing lasting emotional harm.

The university reinforced its zero-tolerance policy on ragging, with strict consequences for those who participate in such behavior, including suspension or expulsion. Students were encouraged to report any incidents of ragging, either as victims or witnesses, to ensure that the campus remains a safe space for everyone. The distinction between **ragging** and **positive interaction** was a key takeaway, emphasizing that while making new friends and engaging with juniors is encouraged, it must be done in a respectful and supportive manner.

On 26th September 2023, Sushant University organized a **Code of Conduct - Annual Awareness Orientation Session** for all students to familiarize them with their rights and responsibilities. The session, held from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m. in room D421, was designed to help students understand the university's code of conduct, the procedures for addressing complaints, and the disciplinary process for violations. Attendance was mandatory, reflecting the importance of the session in ensuring that students are aware of the guidelines they must follow to maintain a respectful and productive academic environment.

# Understanding Your Rights as a Student

The first topic on the agenda was **Understanding Your Rights as a Student**, focusing on key areas such as freedom of speech, privacy, and personal rights within the university. Faculty members outlined that students at Sushant University have the right to express their opinions and ideas freely, whether in class discussions, university events, or other forums, as long as this expression does not infringe on the rights of others or disrupt the academic environment. Students were encouraged to use their voices responsibly, ensuring that their contributions to debates and discussions remain respectful and constructive.

Students also learned about their **right to privacy**. The university is committed to protecting personal information, including academic records, medical details, and other sensitive data. Faculty emphasized that student privacy will be maintained in compliance with institutional policies and applicable laws. However, students were also reminded of their responsibility to respect the privacy of others and to avoid sharing personal or sensitive information about their peers without consent.

Additionally, the session highlighted that students have the right to be treated with fairness and respect, regardless of their background, beliefs, or personal characteristics. Discrimination and harassment are strictly prohibited, and any violation of these principles would result in disciplinary action.

**Procedures for Addressing Complaints and Grievances** 



The second segment of the session focused on the **Procedures for Addressing Complaints and Grievances**. Students were introduced to the university's well-established grievance redressal mechanism, designed to ensure that any issues related to academics, behavior, or administrative processes are resolved promptly and fairly.

Students were informed that if they encounter any issues—whether related to academic disputes, unfair treatment, or harassment—they should first approach the concerned faculty member or department head. If the issue is not resolved at that level, they can escalate the matter to the university's grievance redressal committee, which is responsible for reviewing complaints and ensuring that proper actions are taken.

Faculty members outlined the steps involved in submitting a formal complaint, emphasizing the importance of providing accurate and clear information to facilitate the investigation process. Students were assured that all complaints would be handled confidentially and that the university is committed to providing a supportive and safe environment for everyone. Additionally, the session highlighted that false or malicious complaints could result in disciplinary action, underlining the need for students to use the grievance system responsibly.

## **Understanding the Disciplinary Process for Code of Conduct Violations**

The final part of the session focused on the **Disciplinary Process for Code of Conduct Violations**. Students were informed about the importance of adhering to the university's code of conduct, which outlines acceptable behavior both inside and outside the classroom. The university's code of conduct covers a wide range of issues, including academic honesty, respectful interactions, and compliance with institutional policies on attendance, punctuality, and behavior.

Faculty members explained that violations of the code of conduct are taken seriously and that the university has a structured disciplinary process in place to address any breaches. Depending on the severity of the violation, consequences may range from verbal warnings to more serious actions such as suspension, expulsion, or legal action, in cases involving criminal behavior.

Students were encouraged to familiarize themselves with the code of conduct and to approach the disciplinary process with an understanding that it exists not to punish, but to maintain a safe, respectful, and productive learning environment. Faculty emphasized that the goal of discipline is to encourage personal growth, accountability, and ethical behavior, which are crucial not only during a student's time at university but also in their future professional and personal lives.


