### Feedback Analysis Report (2019-20)

The university follows a sound system for curriculum and syllabi updation. The office of Dean Academic Affairs of the University asks for feedback to be received from all stakeholders namely: students, teachers, alumni and employers/industry experts. The same is analysed and is shared with the respective members of the teaching faculty in order to incorporate or update the syllabi according to suggestions by the stakeholders.

The questionnaire consisted of questions wherein the stakeholders had to put a tick mark based on satisfaction with the programme curriculum. A common questionnaire was used for teachers, industry experts/employers and alumni while a separate one was used for students.

As per feedback received by various stakeholders the new syllabus formulated was appreciated by all. As per feedback taken in the months of August and September 2020, most of the stakeholders thought the syllabus should be continued and assessed gradually. The most important issue at hand is the internship and the OCIs that involved students to get out to different cities and was recommended to be proposed by many. Another major suggestion was the credits and hours to be streamlined as per the latest COA guidelines.

#### **Specific feedback from each stakeholder group was as follows:**

- Students mentioned their appreciation for the new syllabus especially the progression in elective courses from 2<sup>nd</sup> year to 5<sup>th</sup> year. Their main concern was about the internship, which they suggested to be postponed due to uncertain circumstances of COVID. Junior batches felt that the OCIS study should be taken after the lockdowns in next semester or later.
- Faculty/Teachers suggested that the mismatched credits that were noted should be revised. COA guidelines should be used to implement this as credits equal to hours. Activities and learning modules that involve going to different cities and locations like OCIS should be changed due to COVID. Internships are not being offered currently and could be a very big concern so therefore it should be postponed to a later time and thesis carried out earlier.
- Alumni and employers seemed to be appreciative of the new syllabus with no major concerns.





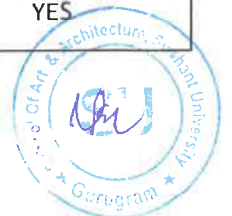

## Summary Feedback/ Suggestions

In the year 2020-21, the syllabus of M Arch in Urban Design

Self-Work is removed from Design Studio reducing the hours from 16 to 14 in first, second and third semester.

Digital tools I & II subject is placed under the track of Skills which will include more digital skills needed in the profession.

More subjects that are common across masters are proposed as common subjects like research paper & skills.

The Internship is now reduced from 8 weeks to 6 weeks so that if student has to attend to a summer school he / she can attend to that too.

Teaching and Research Assistantship is under Skills III in semester 3.

Self-Work is increased from 4 hours to 6 hours in Thesis Studio and Tutorial is removed.

Teaching and Research Assistantship is under Skills IV which will have entrepreneurship skills & project planning too.

Overall Credits for the Programme is now 120 (Standard Across all M Arch Programmes)

The majority of the course was covered in class, and the library resources, as well as the placement activities, were acceptable. Most students felt the professors were usually helpful and that the internal evaluation was fair. And the student-teacher interaction is positive, and the administrative staff is supportive. Overall, most students believed their college experience was intellectually engaging.



  
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## MBA faculty feedback 2020-21

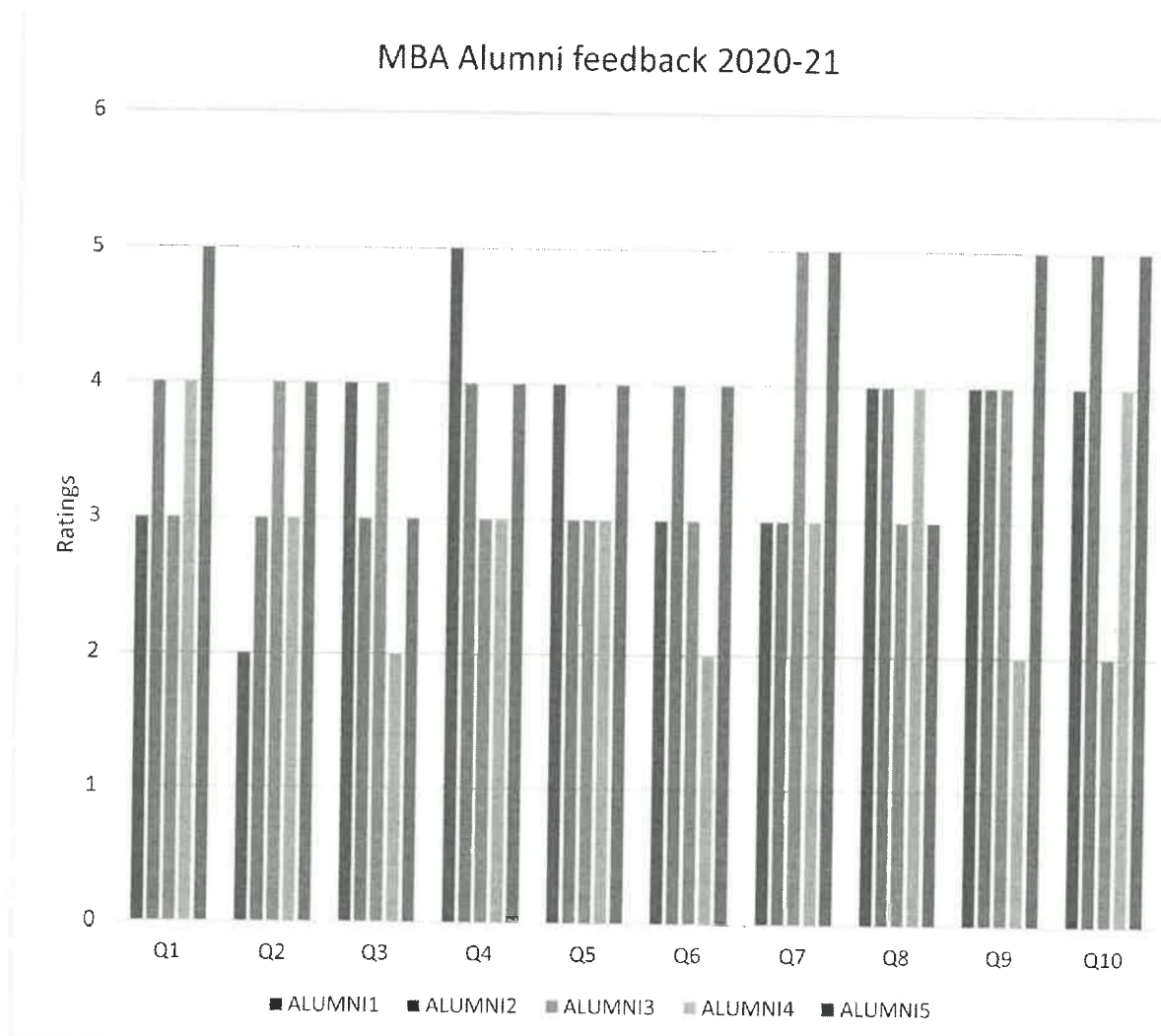

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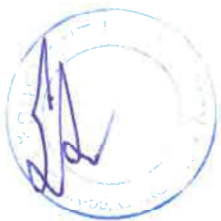
## MBA Alumni feedback 2020-21

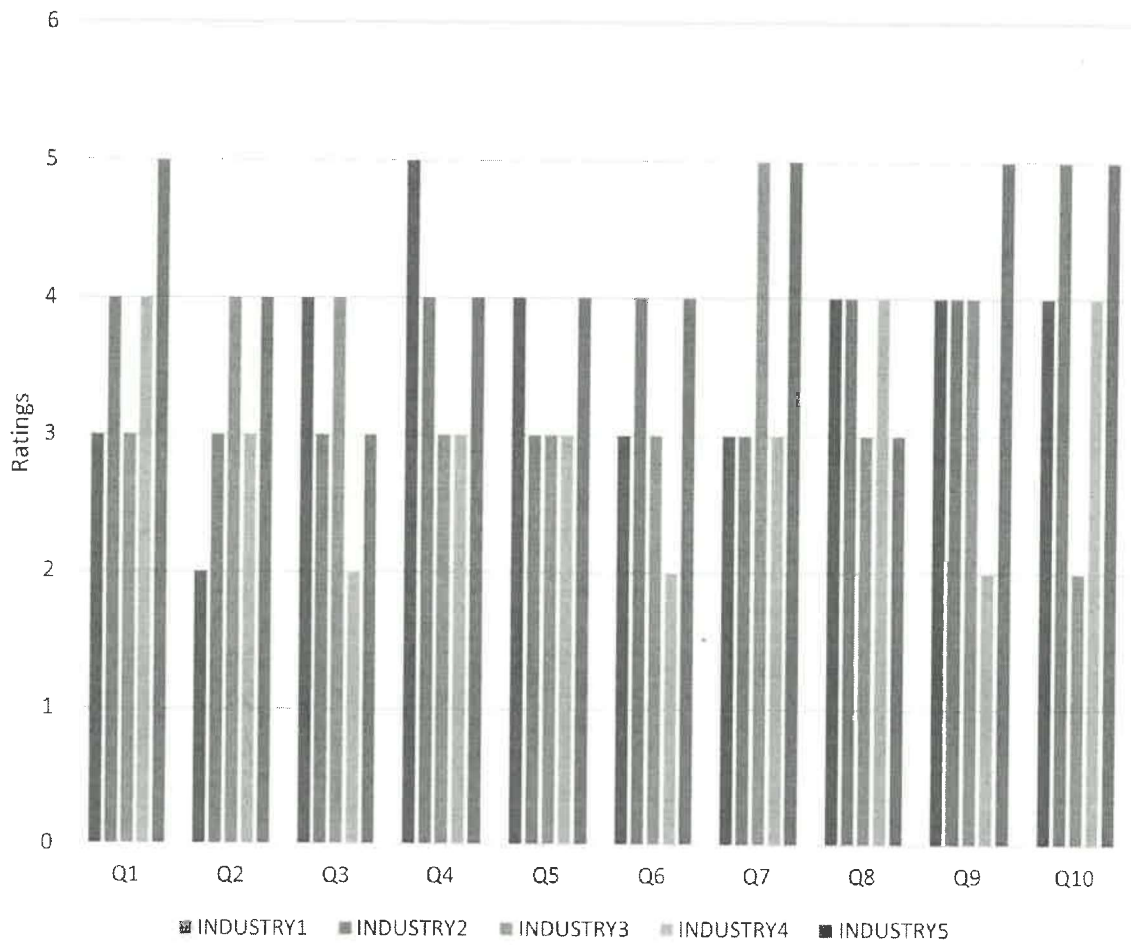
Placement and training services should also be improved.

The examination of stakeholder feedback was performed. This information enables us to assess our strengths and identify areas for development. The report on actions performed is provided below.

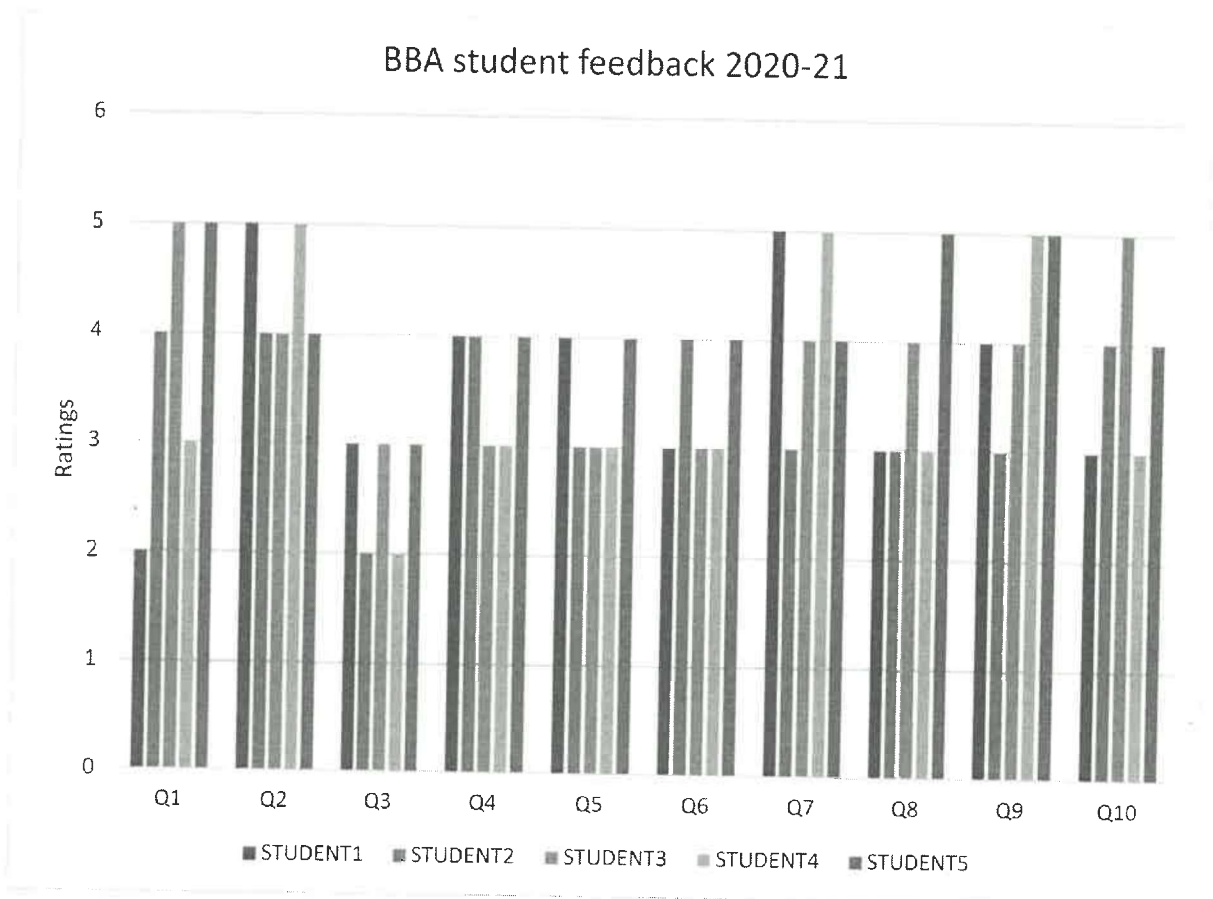

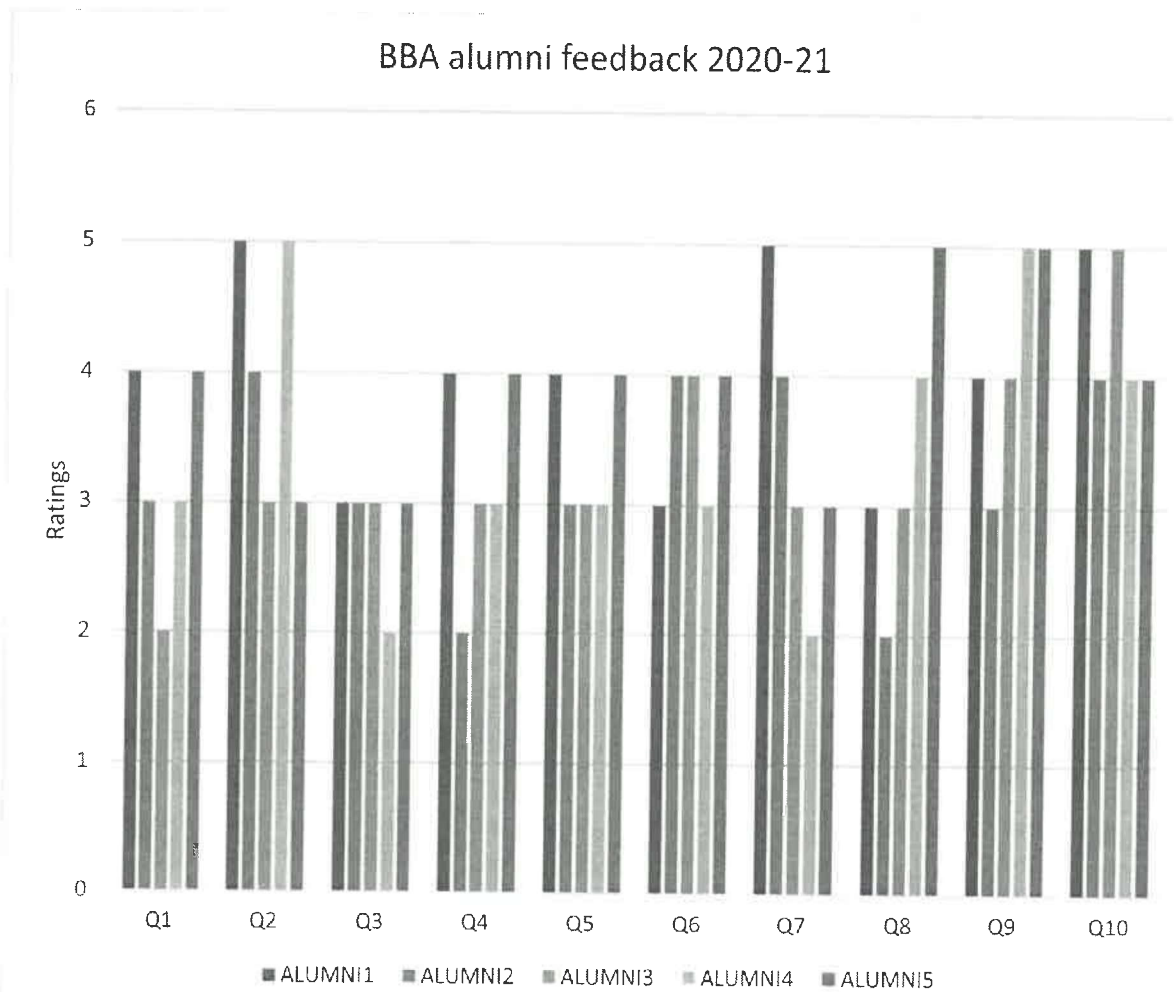


### Summary:

84-93% of students are happy with the career-oriented curriculum and stated that it was very useful in finding job post graduation.

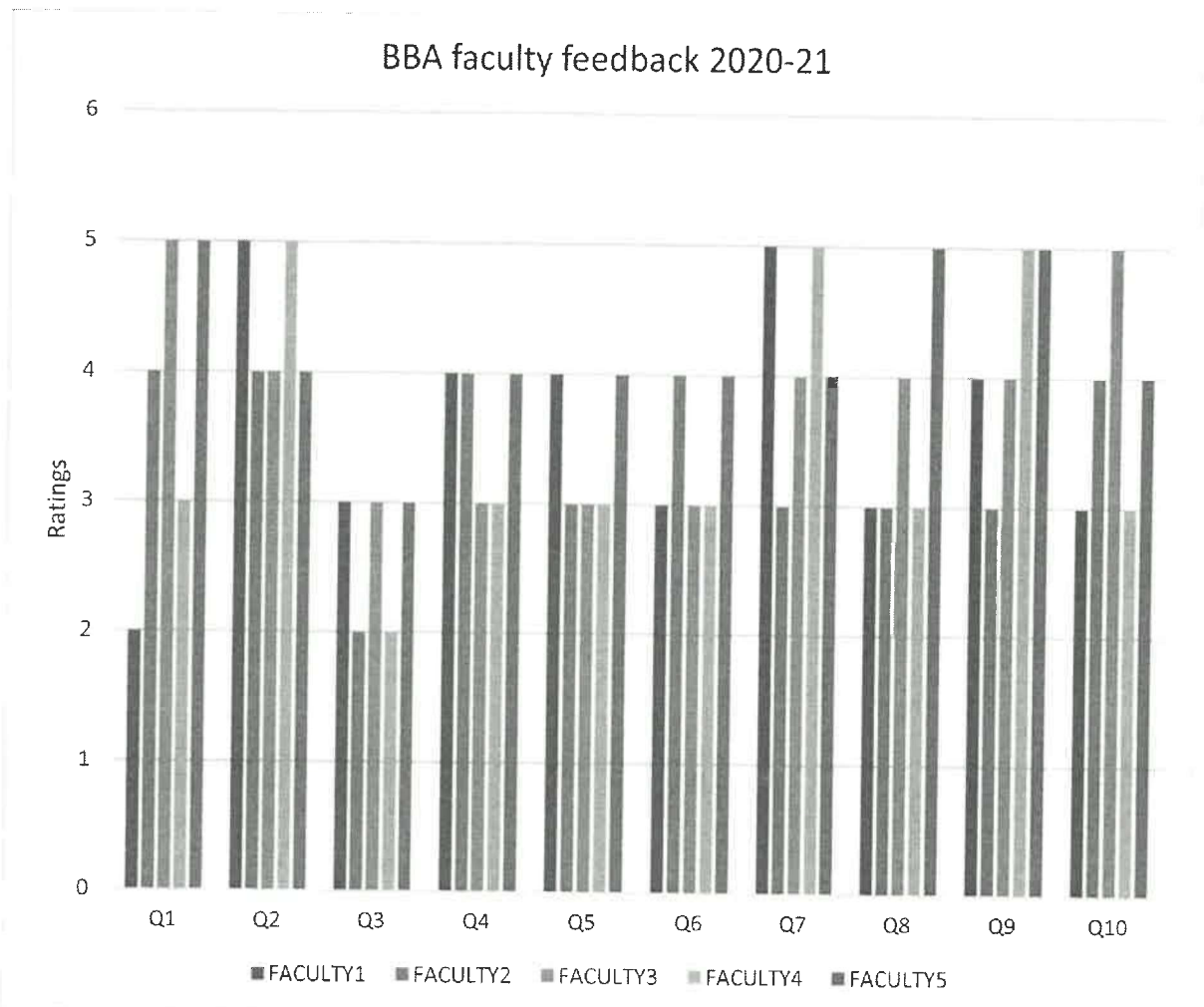
91% of graduates are pleased with the Programme curriculum.

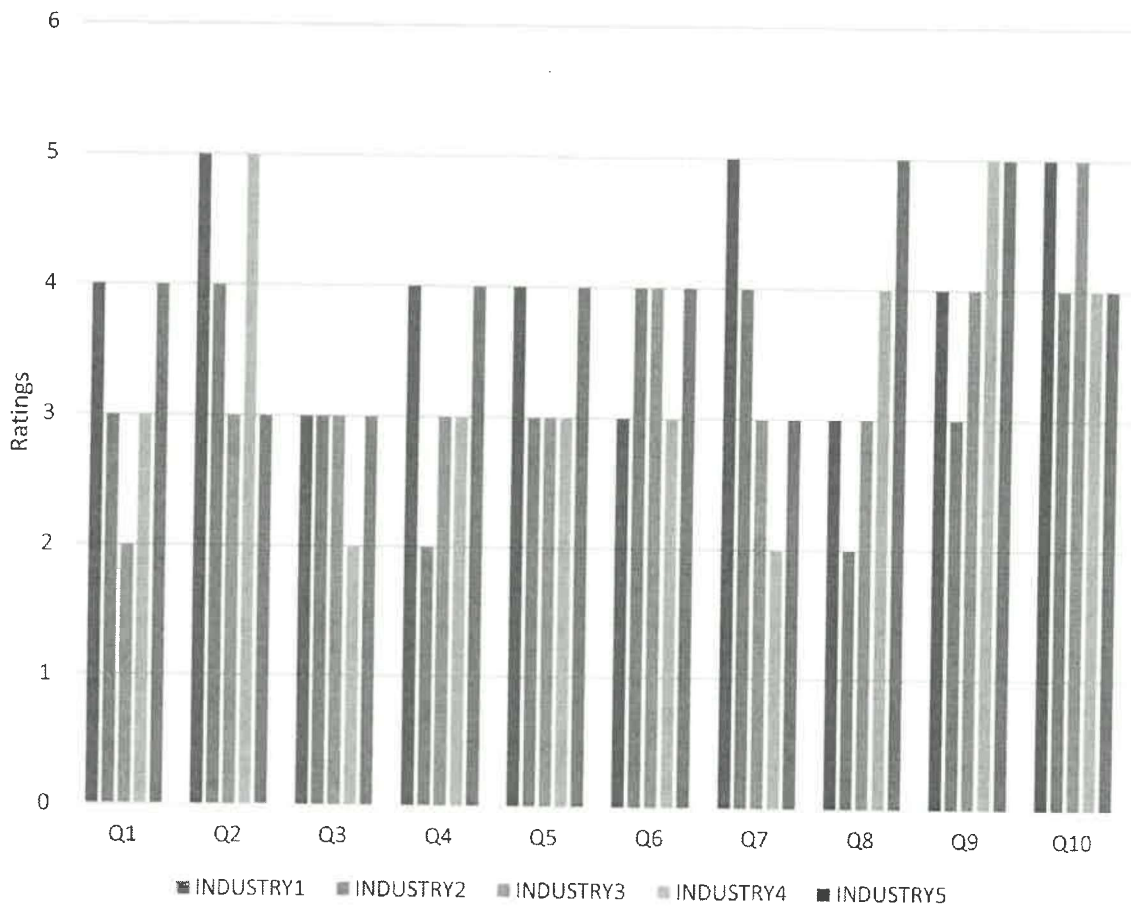

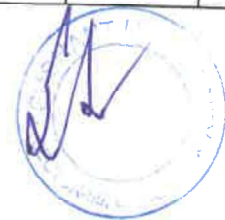

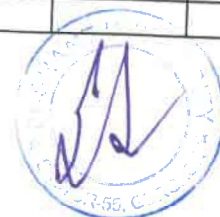
