On 12th November 2020, the School of Engineering and Technology (SET) at Sushant University, in collaboration with the NGO IAmGurgaon, hosted an online event titled **"Shield Against COVID: Vaccination Awareness for a Safer Tomorrow."** This virtual initiative was aimed at educating students, staff, and the community about the importance of COVID-19 vaccination and the vital role it plays in combating the pandemic.

As the world battled the uncertainty of COVID-19, this event provided timely and essential information on the vaccination process, dispelling myths, and addressing common fears. The event brought together healthcare professionals, community leaders, and volunteers from IAmGurgaon who shared their insights on how vaccinations work and their significance in building herd immunity. The session highlighted the science behind vaccines, their safety, and efficacy, emphasizing that they are a crucial tool in protecting individuals and communities from the virus. Sushant Legal Aid Clinic successfully conducted a legal awareness session, exclusively for the students of Manaskriti school of Gurugram on "Millennials and Cyber Security" on 26th Feb, 2021, Time: 12pm to 1pm.

Our speakers of the event were: Prof Vidushi, Cyber Security Laws- Assistant Professor, School of Law, Sushant University, Dhaarna Sehgal, Convenor and Student Coordinator (SLAC)

The objective of the webinar was to educate young students regarding various safety measures that should be taken for online activities like installing anti-virus and not to accept any files from unknown persons. Prof Vidushi addressed the students queries regarding cyber crimes in India. The speaker, a cybersecurity expert, discussed how millennials, who are often labeled as digital natives, navigate a landscape filled with cyber threats such as phishing attacks, identity theft, and data breaches. The lecture emphasized the need for millennials to adopt proactive security measures, including strong password practices, two-factor authentication, and awareness of the privacy settings on social media platforms. The expert also highlighted the importance of understanding the potential risks associated with emerging technologies, such as the Internet of Things (IoT) and mobile applications, which can expose personal information if not properly secured.

The lecture concluded with practical tips and strategies for millennials to enhance their cybersecurity awareness and resilience. Participants were encouraged to take an active role in protecting their digital identities and to engage in continuous learning about cybersecurity best practices. The interactive session included a Q&A





The session, led by certified art therapists, aimed at providing a safe space for individuals to express their thoughts and feelings using various forms of art, including drawing, painting, and sculpting. Art therapy is widely recognized as a therapeutic approach to address emotional issues such as anxiety, trauma, and depression, without the need for verbal communication. During the session, participants were encouraged to freely engage in artistic activities, which helped them process difficult emotions, gain self-awareness, and experience a sense of relief and accomplishment. The session also included group discussions where individuals could share their experiences, fostering a sense of community and mutual support.</p> <p>This event was held on 27 May 2021. For this event, an expert Psychologist was invited to conduct a session for the participants. The event was a huge success seeing active participation of more than 50 people.</p> <p>In this hands-on session, the expert taught about the Enzo Circle encouraging participants to practice making the same daily to relieve stress and embark on the journey of self-exploration.</p>



	<p>The outcome of the session was overwhelmingly positive, with participants reporting a sense of emotional release and greater clarity regarding their personal challenges. For many, art therapy served as an effective non-verbal method to communicate complex emotions they found difficult to express otherwise. The facilitators emphasized the role of creativity in healing and personal growth, and several participants expressed interest in continuing art therapy as part of their mental health routine. The session highlighted the potential of art as a therapeutic tool for emotional well-being and the importance of integrating creative therapies into broader mental health practices.</p>
