Subject: Amendment - I to the ProgramPurchase Agreement ("Amendment - I")

We refer to the "Program Purchase Agreement" dated 18 February 2021 ("Agreement")_executed between upGrad Education Private Limited ("Upgrad") and Sushant University (erstwhile Ansal University) ("University") (hereinafter jointly referred to as "Parties") for the purpose of creating an online program to be hosted on the Upgrad Platform and in accordance with the terms and conditions as more particularly detailed in the Agreement.

- Pursuant to mutual discussions, the Parties have decided to add the following clause **(I)** to the Recital of the Agreement:
- D. The University and Upgrad have mutually decided to enter into this Amendment I, pursuant to which Upgrad shall create an outcome-based and engaging online program in the name of "Masters of Business Administration ("MBA") and Bachelor of Business Administration ("BBA") in Digital Marketing and Business Analytics" ("MBA-BBA Program") or any other mutually agreed name. This MBA-BBA Program which will be hosted by the Upgrad Platform, designed in consultation with the University, in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement. The details of this MBA-BBA Program are given in Annexure C attached to the Amendment-I and form a part of this Agreement.
- Pursuant to mutual discussions, the Parties have decided to add the following sub-(II) Clause to Clause 1 of the Agreement:
- 1.4(a) "MBA BBA Program" means the Masters of Business Administration and Bachelor of Business Administration in Digital Marketing And Business Analytics course being conducted for a period of 5 years per Batch, which includes the Upgrad Program.
- Pursuant to mutual discussions, the Parties have decided to replace the following sub-(III) Clause to Clause 7 of the Agreement:
- It has the legal right, power and authority to enter into this Agreement and the 7.1 (a) corresponding Amendment -I and perform all of its obligations, terms and conditions hereunder and;
- Pursuant to mutual discussions, the Parties have decided to add the following (IV) Clauses to Clause 7 of the Agreement:
- The University has obtained all the required regulatory and other approvals from the 7.4. appropriate authorities for the execution of the corresponding Amendment -I to this Agreement and the performance of its obligations hereunder;
- The University represents and warrants that it has been accorded and shall maintain the 7.5. status of a University Grants Commission ("UGC") compliant and affiliated University (according to UGC Letter no. F. 8-20/2021 (CPP-I/PU) dated 29.10.2020 indicating the



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change of name from Ansal University to Sushant University and F.No. 8-20/2012 (CPP-I/PU) indicating that Ansal University is recognized by the UGC). The University shall provide the MBA-BBA Program in due compliance with the laws, rules and regulations of the University Grants Commission and other regulatory authorities and statutory bodies.

- (V) Pursuant to mutual discussions, the Parties have decided to add the following subclause to Clause 12 of the Agreement as follows:
- 12 (i) Upgrad shall not provide the MBA-BBA Program to any other universities that are located within Gurugram, India for a period of 1 year commencing from 28th June 2021 subject to at all times the number of Students in the Batch of MBA-BBA Program are 30 (thirty) or more. If the number of Students in any Batch reduces by 30 Students, the said exclusivity provision shall not apply. However, in the event Upgrad decides to do so, Upgrad will notify the University of the same before entering into a definitive agreement with such university in writing, to allow the University to determine if such partnership would conflict with the interests of the University. The University shall, within 15 (fifteen) days from the date of the receipt of such information from Upgrad, provide its written consent failing which it will be deemed approved. The University confirms that such consent shall not be reasonably be withheld by the University.

All other terms and conditions of the Agreement shall continue to apply mutatis mutandis and shall be valid and binding on both parties.

All the capitalized terms used but not defined herein shall have the respective meanings set forth in the Agreement.

FARE Labs Private Limited, through its duly authorized signatory, Mr.D. Mathur (Founder and Chairman) a company having its registered Office at L-17/3, DLF Phase – 2, IIFCO Chowk, M.G. Road, Gurgaon –122002, Haryana, India (which expression shall unless it be repugnant to the context or meaning thereof shall deem to mean and include its affiliates, subsidiaries, sister concerns, successors and permitted assignees) of the Second Party.

School of Health Sciences, Sushant University (First Party) and the FARE Labs Pvt Ltd (Second Party) referred individually above shall be collectively termed herein as Parties.

1. Object and Purpose:-

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That the parties herein agree to research and training foundation. That the parties students as well as faculty exchange of knowledge between the two institutes and promote the skill development in the Pharmaceutical Sciences domain as per industry standards and employability requirements. - vi. All joint activities will be realized through the mutual agreement and clearly established conditions and mutual obligations of the appropriate university/Industrial
- vii. Mutual organization of workshop, seminars and academic exchange.
- viii.Co-development of tools and databases pertaining to common objectives of both

3. Confidentiality and Intellectual Property Rights:

The Parties will use reasonable efforts to cause its respective agents, employees, and representatives to minimize distribution and duplication and prevent unauthorized disclosure of the Confidential Information of the other party. For the purpose of this MOU, "Confidential Information" shall mean any and all technical or non-technical information or knowledge relating to the business. Each Party shall maintain all of the other Party's confidential Information in strict confidence and in a secure environment and shall protect such information with the same degree of care that such Party exercises with its own confidential information. Except as provided in this MOU, no Party shall use or disclose any confidential information of the other Party without the express prior written consent of the other Party.

If the Receiving Party is required to disclose the confidential information, in lieu of and as a part of a judicial process, government investigation, legal proceeding, or other similar process, the Receiving Party will give prior written notice of such requirement to the

Both the Parties shall maintain confidentiality towards each other and will not disclose any confidential information, without written permission to any third Party, person, entity, etc. in any manner, directly or indirectly. For the purpose of this MOU, "Confidential Information" shall mean any and all technical or non-technical information or know-how relating to the business, services and/or products of the disclosing Party or a third party, including without limitation of any research products, services, ideas, know-how, methods, business plans, developments

inventions, trademarks/logos, processes, techniques, designs, components, parts, documents, drawings, electronic files, data, sketches, plans, specifications, software, and/or distribution, engineering, marketing, customer, vendor, financial, merchandising, sales, and employee information and/or other materials which are disclosed by one Party or on its behalf to the other Party or its employees or agents, directly or indirectly, in writing, orally, electronically, or by drawings or inspection.

However, it excludes any information which is:-

- i. Already in the public domain or becomes published or available to the public other than by a breach of this Agreement or any confidentiality obligation owed to the disclosing Party, but Confidential Information shall not be deemed to be in the public domain merely because any part of the said Confidential Information is embodied in general disclosures or because individual features, components or combinations thereof are known or become known to the public;
- ii. Rightfully received from a third party without breaching any obligation of confidentiality under this agreement and that the received information is not derived out of or pursuant to the confidential information disclosed by the Disclosing Party pursuant to this MOU.;
- iii. Independently developed by employees or agents of the receiving Party without direct or indirect access to or use of the Confidential Information of the disclosing Party;
- iv. Known to the receiving Party at the time of disclosure without an obligation of confidentiality; or
- v. Produced in compliance with applicable Law or a court order, provided that the receiving Party first gives the disclosing Party reasonable notice of such Law or order and gives the disclosing Party opportunity to oppose and/or attempt to limit such production, unless the Law or court order prohibits giving of such notice. In such cases, the receiving Party will only disclose those portions of the Confidential Information that are legally required and will use all reasonable efforts to maintain the confidential treatment of such Confidential Information.
- vi. All rights pertaining to any intellectual property generated / created / invented in the due course of the project, will be the joint property of the First Party and the Second Party. Terms and conditions regarding transferring / assigning / selling these rights shall be governed by a separate written and agreed to document, if required.

4. General Conditions

i. This MOU does not establish a joint venture or partnership between the Parties The MOU is intended only to provide general principles and key terms for initial co-operation and to facilitate further discussions.

- ii. Both the parties can do mutual cobranding using each other's brand names/logos in their respective websites and marketing collaterals.
- iii. Both the parties are hereby agreeing, under this MOU, to indemnify and hold each other harmless.
- iv. Both the parties shall mutually respect the confidentiality and intellectual ownership of information shared between them. The new intellectual property being developed /generated under this MOU will carry the equal rights of ownership among First Party and Second party.

5. Termination

Term and Termination of the MOU:

The MOU shall be effective and enforceable from the date of authentication by both the Parties. The MOU shall be valid for a period of 2 years. Before the expiry of the MOU, in case either of the parties do not notify within ninety days in writing to the other that they wish to rescind from the MOU, the MOU shall be automatically extended for a further period as agreed.

It may, however, be open to either of the Party to terminate the MOU by giving the other party a notice period of 30 days. However, both the Parties will meet any residual obligations in connection with the present MOU, notwithstanding its termination.

- i. This MOU will be effective for period of 2 years from the date of signing. It may be further renewed by mutual agreement in writing.
- ii. Amendment shall be made in MOU subject to the written consent of both the parties.
- iii. MOU shall be terminated by the either party after 30 days prior notice in writing to the other party.

6. Governing Law and Dispute Resolution

Any disputes arising out of the project shall be amicably settled by First Party and the Second Party. Any unsettled disputes may be subject to resolution as per the Indian Arbitration and Conciliation Act 1996 and The MOU between First Party and the Second Party shall be subject to the laws of India under jurisdiction of the courts of Gurgaon, Haryana.

The validity, interpretation, enforceability and performance of this MOU shall be governed and construed in accordance with the Laws in India. Venue of settlement

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for any disputes which may arise under this MOU shall be at Gurgaon, Haryana. Disputes arising between the parties out of or in connection with this MOU shall as far as possible be settled amicably. If amicable settlement cannot be reached within 30 days from the date of the occurrence of the dispute, the matter under dispute shall be finally settled without recourse to the courts, in accordance with the provisions of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act 1996 and amendments thereto, if any. The arbitration shall be conducted by the arbitrator(s) appointed by mutual consent of both the parties in accordance with the rules of the said Act. The arbitral award shall be final and binding upon both the parties. The arbitration proceedings shall be held at Gurgaon, Haryana. All proceedings shall be conducted, including all documents presented in such proceedings, in English language.

That the Courts of Gurgaon, Haryana. shall have jurisdiction over any or all matters/ dispute that may arise out of this MOU.

7. Notices

Any notice or other information required to this MOU will be communicated by a Party to the other Party through registered mode of service only.

In case of any change to communication address of the Parties, the same shall be communicated to the other side within 15 days, to the change of that address.

Any and all notices, consents, claims, requests or other communications required or permitted to be given under any of the provisions of this MOU shall be in writing either through facsimile or by mail to be delivered by hand or by post / courier against acknowledgement. The notice shall be deemed to have been received on the next day of transmission if sent through E.mail and five days of date of dispatch if sent through regular post. The notice aforementioned shall be given in attention of the concerned persons at the following addresses (or to such other address as any Party may specify by notice to other Party):-

8. Non Solicitation

The Parties shall not directly or indirectly solicit, interfere with or endeavour to entice away employees from the other Party either on their own account or for any other person or entity, during the continuation of this MOU and for a period of 3 month after the termination of this MOU, for whatever reason.

9. Indemnification

Both Parties shall indemnify, defend and hold each other harmless from and against any and all liabilities, claims, damages, interest, judgments, costs, or expenses, including without limitation fees and expenses of the legal counsel or other professionals, made against or suffered by the other party that may arise under this MOU.

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10. Force Majeure and Natural Calamity

For the purposes of this MOU, force majeure shall mean and include an Act of God (including but not limited to flood, earthquake, typhoon, epidemic or other natural calamity) war or armed conflict or the serious threat of the same (including but not limited to prohibition or restriction of importation or exportation) or any other cause beyond the reasonable control of the Parties hereto including but not limited to industrial relation problem involving government/quasi government organization /banks/ transportation / Associations / others public bodies. In case of force-majeure, the parties shall inform the second party about the liabilities to be carried out by them, and are free from them after the receiving an MOU of force-majeure acceptance and it shall be base for the expiration of the corresponding part or as a whole of the MOU. Documents confirming the condition of force-majeure will be required for submission during the negotiation process, and Parties shall mutually consult each other to decide the course of action to be adopted.

11. Severability

If any provision of this MOU shall be found by any Government or administrative body of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unenforceable, the invalidity or unenforceability of such provision shall not affect the other provisions of this MOU and all provisions not affected by such invalidity or unenforceability shall remain in full force and effect. 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The Service Receiver and Service Provider shall hereinafter jointly be referred to as "Parties" and individually as "Party".

WHEREAS:

- (1) Service Receiver has its campus in Gurugram, Haryana. It is a distinguished educational institute established with a mandate to serve the academic and professional needs of the students in the country. It is engaged in imparting value based professional education and is approved by the University Grants Commission.
- (2) Service Receiver has enrolled students in its 4 (four) years, 3 (three) years under graduate and 2 (two) years Post Graduate term course ("Course")
- (3) Service Provider is a private limited company incorporated under the Companies Act, 2013. It is engaged in the business of providing support services like admission, online journals and content, conducting examination, providing technology tools and assistance with management and value added services to educational institutes. It also renders value added training, upskilling, extracurricular activities and placement support services to the students.
- (4) The Service Provider has approached the Service Receiver and has expressed its desire to provide certain services to the Service Receiver and has also represented to the Service Receiver that it has the necessary infrastructure, manpower, expertise and the financial capabilities to perform the functions as may be assigned by the Service Receiver from time to time.
- (5) The Service Receiver wishes to engage Service Provider as an independent contractor for the purpose of assistance in support services as required.
- (6) Service Provider is willing to perform the services, as set out in detail in Clause 3 of this Agreement on the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual agreements, covenants, representations and warranties set forth in the Agreement, and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is acknowledged by the Parties, the Parties hereby agree as follows:

1 Definitions

The following words shall have the following meanings:

- a) "Agreement" shall mean this services agreement including the annexures, as amended, modified and/or supplemented from time to time;
- "Applicable Laws" shall mean all applicable (a) statutes, enactments, acts of legislature or parliament, laws, ordinances, rules, by-laws, regulations, notifications, guidelines, policies, directions, circulars, directives and orders of any Governmental Authority, tribunal, board, court or recognised stock exchange; (b) approvals, authorities, walvers or licenses from Governmental Authorities; and (c) orders, decisions, injunctions, judgments, awards and

decrees of or agreements with any Governmental Authority as applicable on the Service Receiver:

- c) "Effective Date" shall mean the date on which the Agreement has been executed by the Parties, as set out herein;
- d) "Services" shall have the meaning ascribed to it in Clause 3.2 below; and
- e) "Term" shall have the meaning ascribed to it in Clause 8 below.

In this Agreement, unless the context otherwise requires,

- a) For the purpose of this Agreement, where the context so admits, (i) the singular shall be deemed to include the plural and vice-versa, (ii) the word "include" and "including" shall be construed without limitation.
- b) The headings and sub-headings are inserted for convenience only and shall not affect the construction and interpretation of this Agreement.
- c) A reference to a statute or statutory provision is a reference to it as it is in force for the time being, taking account of any amendment, extension, or re-enactment and includes any subordinate legislation for the time being in force made under it.
- d) In addition to the terms defined in Clause 1, certain other capitalized terms are defined elsewhere in this Agreement and whenever such terms are used in this Agreement they shall have their respective defined meanings, unless the context expressly or by necessary implication otherwise requires.

2 Appointment.

- 2.1 The Service Receiver hereby appoints Service Provider to render services as described below during the Course for such period and on the terms set forth in this Agreement. Service Provider accepts such appointment and agrees to render the services herein set forth for the compensation herein provided.
- 2.2 Service Provider agrees to render the following support services during the Course as categorized below to the Service Receiver, including but not limited to:

A. Admission support services

- Project management services including coordinating with the students, tracking of admission, collection and digitisation of data, etc.
- Provision of other administrative support in connection with the student admission process including but not limited to admitting the students as per the standards set by the Service Recipient

Assistance in designing the prospectus, student co omunicatio ns, student brochures and other informational material, etc hamer New Delhi

B. Assistance in faculty upskilling

- Assistance with training of faculty, including counselling sessions to develop and enhance their skills;
- Assistance with periodic knowledge update sessions for the faculty

C. <u>Technology support service</u>

- Provision of learning management and other technology platforms and tools including access to training portals, class scheduler, digital student community app, etc
- Assistance in maintenance of student database in relation to their learning and developments
- Technology Support services in connection with the platform and tools provided

D. Other services

- Providing Internship opportunity to all admitted students.
- Such other support and administrative services as may be requested by the Service Recipient

E. Corporate relation outreach.

- Assistance in terms of onboarding corporates for recruitment
- Assistance in maintaining relationship with corporates for Industry Immersion in the program
- Ensuring the recruitment of all admitted students

It is clarified that the role of the Service Provider is limited to assist the Service Receiver in relation to services requested by them. Service Receiver shall have the power/ authority to decide and finalize all key aspects in relation to admission, issue of fees receipts and degrees, finalization of course content, examination and student assessment.

3 Duties

Obligations of the Service Receiver

- 3.1 Service Receiver agrees and acknowledges that it has read this Agreement and shall comply with all applicable duties, obligations and restrictions set forth in this Agreement to the extent they apply to Service Receiver.
- 3.2 Service Receiver shall maintain adequate infrastructure and adequate skilled faculties for imparting of education.
- 3.3 Service Receiver shall be responsible for compliance with the Applicable Laws and adherence with the fees regulatory norms, permits, approvals, etc.

Service Receiver shall be solely responsible for imparting addition, maintaining its affiliations, accreditations and facilities, delivery of accreditations, etc. as recognized by and in accordance with the directions issued by the regulatory

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authorities, including obtaining and maintaining relevant consents and approvals from the regulatory authorities.

3.5 Service Recipient shall provide requisite and reasonable access, support and assistance as may be required by the Service Provider from time to time in relation to provision of the Services.

Obligations of the Service Provider

- 3.6 Service Provider agrees and acknowledges that it has read this Agreement and shall comply with all applicable duties, obligations and restrictions set forth in this Agreement to the extent they apply to Service Provider.
- 3.7 Service Provider agrees and undertakes to use its best efforts to comply with the instructions and directions issued by the Service Receiver.
- 3.8 Service Provider and its officers, directors, agents and representatives will exercise their best judgment in carrying out their obligations hereunder.
- 3.9 Service Provider shall undertake the Services in a professional, diligent and timely manner, using due skill and care and in a manner compliant with industry and professional standards.
- 3.10 Service Provider shall ensure that the Services performed under this Agreement confirm to the specifications and instructions mutually agreed with the Service and ensure that all personnel who are deputed to perform the Services under this Agreement are appropriately trained and qualified to perform such Services, including familiarizing them with applicable policies and procedures relevant to the Services.

4 <u>Dealings</u>

Notwithstanding anything contained in this Agreement, the Service Provider shall not, absent express written consent, be authorized to act in the name or on behalf of the Service Receiver and shall not have any power to enter into any agreement, contract, transaction or arrangement on behalf of or in the name of the Service Receiver.

5 Remuneration and Expenses

5.1 In connection with the performance of its duties herein, the Service Receiver will pay the Service Provider, such compensation and fees as outlined in Annexure 1 (the "Fees").

5.2 Service Provider shall raise the invoices on a periodic basis as may be mutually agreed

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- 5.3 Each party shall bear the costs incurred by them in relation to their duties and services rendered.
- 5.4 The Fees shall be subject to periodic review by the Parties.
- 5.5 The services under this Agreement would be provided continuously or on recurrent basis for a period of 3 years and will be automatically renewed unless otherwise agreed with periodic payment obligations as mutually agreed by the parties, in accordance with Clause 5 and 6 of this Agreement.
- 5.6 It is mutually agreed between the Parties that an escrow account shall be opened for collection of fees from students

6 Term and Termination

- 6.1 This Agreement shall commence on the Effective Date and shall continue in full force and effect thereafter for an initial period of 3 years. Thereafter, this Agreement shall be extended for such time period as mutually agreed between the Parties in writing.
- This Agreement may be terminated at any time with the mutual written agreement of both the Service Provider and the Service Receiver, with written notice of not less than 3 (three) months. However, the Agreement shall remain operative till the completion of the ongoing batch/ program already enrolled or where more than 10 students have been enrolled in the upcoming batch/ program.
- 6.3 This Agreement may be terminated by Service Provider if it becomes illegal for Service Provider to perform its duties under this Agreement.
- 6.4 Either Party shall have the right to terminate this Agreement, with immediate effect, if a petition for winding-up or dissolution of the other Party is filed in a court of competent jurisdiction and if such petition is not withdrawn within [30] (thirty) days of filing of such petition, by giving written notice of such termination to the other Party.
- 6.5 The right to terminate this Agreement shall be without prejudice to all rights and remedies available to the Parties under Law, including without limitation, the right to seek, as an alternative to termination, specific performance of the obligations under this Agreement

7 Representations of Service Provider and of the Service Receiver

- 7.1 Service Provider hereby represents and warrants that:
 - 7.1.1 Service Provider has the legal right, power and authority to enter into, deliver and perform its obligations under this Agreement and all other documents and instruments required to be executed pursuant thereto or in connection therewith, and such documents, when executed, will constitute valid and binding obligations and be enforceable against Service Provider in accordance with their respective terms;

7.1.2 Service Provider has obtained all consents, authorizations and permissions as may be required for the purpose of executing this Agreement and performing its

obligations hereunder.

8 General

- 8.1 Conduct of Affairs: The parties hereto agree that Service Provider shall at all times, conduct itself and discharge its functions hereunder in such a manner as to ensure that at no point in time shall Service Provider take any decision on behalf of the Service Receiver.
- 8.2 Service Provider will render the Services set forth in this Agreement at its own expense, including, without limitation, the salaries of employees necessary for such services, the facilities required to provide such services and operating expenses.
- 8.3 Relationship of Parties: The relation between the Parties hereto shall be on principal to principal basis. This Agreement is intended to create, and creates, a contractual relationship for services to be rendered by an independent contractor and is not intended to create and does not create, a partnership, joint venture, association of person or agency or employment between the Parties for any purpose (or any other parties).

9 Governing Law and Dispute Resolution

This Agreement will be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of India. The Parties shall refer any disputes arising between them which relate to this Agreement or transactions contemplated hereby to a sole arbitrator to be jointly appointed by the Parties. The arbitration proceedings shall be governed by the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 and shall be conducted in the English language. The venue of arbitration shall be Gurgaon. Subject to the aforesaid arbitration provision, each Party agrees that the courts at Gurgaon shall have exclusive jurisdiction.

10 Amendments

No provisions of this Agreement shall be amended or altered in any way unless made in writing and duly executed by authorized representatives of each of the Service Receiver and the Service Provider.

11 Notices and Advice

Any notice or other document to the Service Receiver and Service Provider to be given under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be deemed duly given if sent by hand-delivery, pre-paid post, courier, facsimile or email to the following addresses:

- 11.2 All notices given pursuant to this Agreement, shall be in writing and shall be deemed to be served as follows:
 - 11.2.1 In the case of any notice delivered by hand, when so delivered;
 - 11.2.2 If sent by pre-paid post or courier, on the 5th clear day after the date of posting;
 - 11.2.3 In the case of any notice sent by facsimile, upon the receipt of a confirmation copy at the sender's facsimile machine; and
 - 11.2.4 If sent by e-mail, 24 hours after the mail is sent by either Party to the other Party at the above respective addresses.

12 FORCE MAJEURE

- 12.1 Neither Party shall be liable to the other Party if and to the extent that the performance or delay in performance of any of its obligations under this Agreement is prevented, restricted, delayed or interfered with due to circumstances beyond the reasonable control of such Party, including changes in Law, fire, flood, storm, explosion, epidemics or pandemics, accident, acts of God, acts of terrorism, war, civil commotion, riots, strikes, lockouts, labour dispute or other concerted act of workmen, acts of Government and/or shortage of material ("Force Majeure Event").
- 12.2 The Party claiming a Force Majeure Event shall promptly notify the other Party in writing, and provide full particulars of the Force Majeure Event, the cause and the date of first occurrence thereof, as soon as possible after the Force Majeure Event and also keep the other Party informed of any further developments.
- 12.3 The Party so affected by a Force Majeure Event shall use its best efforts to remove the cause of non-performance, and the Parties shall resume performance hereunder with the utmost dispatch when the Force Majeure Event is resolved.

13 Counterparts

This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which, when so executed and delivered, shall be deemed an original instrument, but all of which together shall constitute a single agreement.

14 Severability

Each clause of this Agreement constitutes a separate and distinct undertaking, covenant and/or provision. In the event that any provision of this Agreement shall be finally determined to be unlawful, such provision shall be deemed severed from this Agreement, but every other provision of this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect, and in substitution for any such provision held unlawful, there shall be substituted by mutual consultation and agreement of the Parties hereto a provision of similar import reflecting the original intent of the Parties to the extent permissible under the Applicable Laws.

15 Assignment

This Agreement shall be binding upon and endure to the benefit of the Parties hereto and their respective successors and permitted assigns. Neither this Agreement nor any of the

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rights, interests or obligations hereunder shall be assigned to any third party, unless otherwise agreed in writing by both the Parties.

16 No Agency

It is clearly understood and accepted by the Parties that this Agreement and the contract between the Parties evidenced by it are on "principal to principal" basis and nothing herein contained shall be construed or understood as constituting either Party hereto the agent or representative of the other under any circumstances and neither Party shall have the right to assume, create or incur any liability or any obligation of any kind, express or implied, against or in the name of or on behalf of the other Party.

17 Survival

The termination or expiration of this Agreement shall not affect any of the provisions of the Agreement which are expressly or by implication to come into effect or to continue in force after such termination or expiration.

TECHNICAL, ADVISORY, KNOWLEDGE AND CAPICITY BUILDING

SUPPORT FOR REFORMS IN CURRICULUM

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This Agreement is being entered into on 24th day of March 2022 between School of Planning and Development (SPD), Sushant University located at Gurugram, represented by the Pro Vice Chancellor & Registrar, Sushant University, Gurugram on the one part,

and

Centre for Science and Environment, located at New Delhi, legally represented by its Executive Director on the other part.

BACKGROUND

SPD, Sushant University is a higher education institute in Haryana, India, specializing education and research in the field of urban planning and development under the umbrella of Sushant University. Sushant University as a singular body has a wide presence across India and overseas with its numerous course, faculty and student. The University campus at Gurugram is regional focal point tertiary education, particularly in the field of planning.

Centre for Science and Environment (CSE) is a non-governmental, independent policy research institution based in Gurugram that was started 1981 by the Mr. Anil Agarwal, a leading figure in India's environment movement. For more than three decades now, CSE has helped shape policies and build public awareness to bring change in areas of pollution mitigation and public health security, low carbon development, natural resource management and livelihood security to make growth sustainable and inclusive. CSE's sustainable building and Habitat Programme is designed to reduce energy and resource consumption, waste generation and emissions from urban development. The program seeks to promote a collaborative system of research, Training and curriculum development in issue related to sustainable development in built environment.

The two institutions agree to jointly promote the cause of sustainable habitat in build sector focusing sustainability in built schemes of buildings and area planning.

PONIT 1: SPECIFIC PURPOSE OF AGREEMENT

The parties agree to cooperate in the following areas: -

1.1 Knowledge Partnership

CSE will act as the knowledge partner of SPD, Sushant University to help in the inclusion of sustainability content in the curriculum. CSE shall assist SPD, Sushant University in providing technical, advisory, knowledge and capacity building support to facilitate handholding in course development and workshops for students and faculty members.

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1.2 Capacity Building and Training Activities

CSE agrees to conduct two seminar/training/workshop in the calendar year of 2022 for students and nominated faculty of the SPD, Sushant University. These training/workshops shall be held either at SPD, Sushant University or one of the CSE's offices at New Delhi and Anil Agarwal Environment Training Institute (AAETI), a residential research, training and demonstration 'green campus' located in Nimli in District Alwar, Rajasthan.

1.3 Need-Based Research and Capacity Building

Based on mutual need, Institutions shall explore additional ways of collaborating to help strengthen the research and capacities. Activities may include joint research, workshops, seminars and conferences. Among other potential areas of cooperation in the field of sustainable habitats. The details of such arrangement shall be negotiated at the appropriate time on a case-to-case basis and be governed by the relevant approval processes.

PONIT 2: RESPONSIBILITIES

Both institutions acknowledge the mutual alignment of their institutional vision, mission and values. Both organizations commit themselves to jointly accomplish the goals of the capacity Building Project.

- 2.1 Sharing of information: Both faculty of SPD, Sushant University, and CSE shall each maintain their respective lawful status with the appropriate authorities for the duration of the Agreement. Either institutions shall keep the other informed of any change whatsoever occurring in the engagement plan which may affect the timely delivery of services and accomplishment of project outcomes.
- 2.2 Financial Support: for seminar(s)/workshop(s)/training(s) conducted at SPD, Sushant University campus, CSE will not charge any course fee for the tannings, including field visits (if any), and also agrees to cover the cost of meals during the period of said training(s) and workshop(s), although venue and associated arrangements for hosting such events shall be arranged by SPD, Sushant University.

For long-term viability and sustainability of the capacity Building Project, Institutions agree to explore and identify respective funding opportunities.

2.3 Focal Person: Both institutions shall each assign a designated focal person (senior Professor from SPD, Sushant University and senior official CSE) to provide support to the project, whose duties include supporting the visits of either institution. Or who will also arrange training and logistics for the smooth implementation of the project.

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POINT 3: LANGUAGE

All written correspondence and activities relating to the project shall be transacted in the English Language.

POINT 4: ACCOUNTABILITY AND COMPLIANCE

The said project shall be implemented in line with relevant policies and law of the Government of India, and shall comply with the institutional guidelines of both Institutions. This AGREEMENT is not binding or legal enforceable, does not impose enforceability of obligation upon the institutions and does not grant any rights.

POINT 5: CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION AND COPYRIGHT

- 5.1 The phrase "Confidential information" shall include all written and oral information which would be exchanged between the Parties, for the effective implementation of this Agreement, which information would specifically include the information relating to the information, of the services provided by CSE and the creation of works pursuant to or during the subsistence of the Agreement.
- 5.2 Neither Institutions shall disclose confidential information of the other party to person or third-party or use of such confidential information for its own purpose at any time without the written of the other Party.
- 5.3 Any idea, innovation, training materials, management processes or documentation arising out of this collaboration shall be the intellectual property of both Institutions. Both Institutions may however use such intellectual materials, but with appropriate acknowledgement to the contributions made by either party.
- 5.4 Confidential Information is not meant to include any information which (a) is publicly available (b) is rightfully received by the parties from third parties; (c) is already in either party's possession and was lawfully received from sources other than the parties or (d) is independently developed by the parties.

POINT 6: FORCE MAJEURE

No institutions covered under this agreement shall be liable for any failure to perform its obligation where such failure is a results of Acts of God, which are here defined as majeure.

POINT 7: DURATION AND TERMINATION

This AGREEMENT shall come into effect on the date of signature by both Institutions and shall remain in force for an initial period of one (1) year, unless otherwise terminated by mutual consent, and with 30 days' prior written notice to the other Institutions.
