pavilion. This Design was conceived from a rigorous mapping session of different sites in Chennai like the Vandalur Zoo, Mylapore, Ambattur Market, Somasundar ground cricket match, OLA & UBER rides, Besant Nagar, Railway Station. Through this mapping exercise, a pavilion design was evolved by the students in Design studio.

The students were involved in the fabrication process of this pavilion and mock installation. The pavilion was shipped and assembled on site in the nature campus by the students.

Designing and constructing a parametric pavilion involves a fusion of architectural creativity, computational design techniques, and precise engineering. A parametric pavilion is characterized by its use of parametric design principles, which allow for the creation of complex, adaptive forms driven by mathematical algorithms and parameters. Here's a detailed description of the process involved in designing and building such a pavilion:

Conceptualization and Ideation: The process begins with conceptualizing the purpose and function of the pavilion. Is it meant to serve as a temporary event space, an art installation, or a functional structure in a public space? Understanding the context and requirements helps in shaping the design direction.

Parametric Design Exploration: Parametric design software such as Grasshopper for Rhinoceros or Autodesk's Dynamo is employed to explore various design possibilities. Designers define parameters such as form, scale, density, and spatial organization, which are then manipulated algorithmically to generate a range of design iterations.

Form Finding and Optimization: Through iterative processes, designers refine the form of the pavilion, balancing aesthetic considerations with structural feasibility and functional requirements. Computational simulations and analysis tools help in optimizing the design for structural stability, material efficiency, and environmental performance.







Material Selection and Fabrication Techniques: Once the design is finalized, the choice of materials and fabrication techniques is crucial. Lightweight and durable materials such as steel, aluminum, timber, or fabric membranes are often preferred for their structural properties and ease of fabrication.

Digital Fabrication and Assembly: Parametric design facilitates the translation of digital models into fabrication-ready data. Techniques such as laser cutting, CNC milling, 3D printing, and robotic fabrication are utilized to precisely manufacture components of the pavilion. Each component is labeled and assembled according to a predefined assembly sequence.

Structural Integrity and Stability: Engineering analysis ensures that the pavilion meets structural requirements and safety standards. Finite element analysis (FEA) and load testing help in evaluating the structural integrity of the design, identifying potential stress points, and making necessary modifications.

Installation and Site Integration: The pavilion is transported to its intended site and assembled according to the preplanned construction sequence. Site-specific considerations such as topography, climate, and surrounding context are taken into account during installation to ensure seamless integration with the environment.

User Experience and Interaction: The parametric pavilion is not merely a static structure but an interactive and experiential space. Consideration is given to user experience, circulation patterns, lighting, and spatial qualities to create an engaging environment that invites exploration and interaction.

Maintenance and Longevity: Proper maintenance strategies are implemented to ensure the longevity and durability of the pavilion. Regular inspections, repairs, and upkeep help in preserving its structural integrity and aesthetic appeal over time.

In conclusion, designing and building a parametric pavilion is a collaborative and multidisciplinary endeavor that combines innovative design thinking, advanced computational techniques, and skilled craftsmanship to create dynamic and




Fig 2 Pavilion Design

CSE supports the integration of renewable energy sources, such as solar panels and wind turbines, to reduce dependency on non-renewable energy and decrease greenhouse gas emissions. The choice of materials and construction practices significantly impacts a building's resilience. During this session, students were given a comprehensive overview of these practices, emphasizing the importance of water sustainability in maintaining an eco-friendly campus.

One of the key areas discussed was the implementation of rainwater harvesting systems. These systems are designed to capture and store rainwater, which is then used for irrigation and other non-potable purposes. This reduces our reliance on municipal water supplies and helps mitigate the impact of drought conditions. The students were shown the various components of the system, including collection surfaces, storage tanks, and distribution networks.

Additionally, the use of greywater recycling was highlighted. Greywater, which is wastewater generated from domestic activities such as laundry and bathing, is treated and reused for landscape irrigation and toilet flushing. This practice not only conserves freshwater but also

reduces the amount of wastewater that needs to be treated and disposed of, thereby lessening our environmental footprint.

Students were also briefed on how they can conduct a water audit for our campus to further enhance these practices. A water audit involves a detailed assessment of water use across the campus, identifying areas where water is wasted and proposing measures to improve efficiency. The students learned about the tools and techniques used in water audits, such as flow meters and leak detection systems, and were encouraged to participate in these efforts to contribute to our ongoing water conservation goals.

Waste Management and Sustainable Farming Practices

Our commitment to sustainability extends beyond water conservation to encompass comprehensive waste management and sustainable farming practices. During this session, students were introduced to the various waste management techniques employed on our campus. These techniques are designed to minimize waste generation, promote recycling, and ensure the proper disposal of waste materials.

One of the key components of our waste management strategy is the segregation of waste at the source. Students learned about the importance of separating biodegradable waste from non-biodegradable waste, and how this practice facilitates more efficient recycling and composting processes. Biodegradable waste, such as food scraps and garden clippings, is composted on-site to produce nutrient-rich compost that is used in our campus gardens and farms.

The session also covered our sustainable farming practices, which aim to ensure minimal waste and maximum productivity. Students were introduced to organic farming techniques, such as crop rotation, natural pest control, and the use of organic fertilizers. These practices not only enhance soil fertility and crop yields but also reduce the reliance on chemical inputs that can harm the environment.

Additionally, the concept of permaculture was discussed. Permaculture is a holistic approach to farming that integrates land, resources, people, and the environment through mutually beneficial

synergies. Students were shown examples of permaculture designs on campus, such as food forests and polycultures, and were encouraged to think about how these principles could be applied in their own communities.

Sustainable Design on Campus

Sustainable design is a cornerstone of our campus infrastructure, and this session focused on the architectural and design elements that make our campus eco-friendly. The students were encouraged to observe and understand the sustainable designs around them, fostering a deeper appreciation for the integration of sustainability in everyday environments.

One of the key aspects discussed was the use of green building materials and construction techniques. Students learned about the benefits of using materials such as bamboo, recycled steel, and low-VOC (volatile organic compound) paints, which reduce the environmental impact of construction and create healthier indoor environments. They were also introduced to passive solar design principles, which optimize natural light and ventilation to reduce the need for artificial lighting and air conditioning.

The session also highlighted the role of green roofs and walls in enhancing the sustainability of our buildings. Green roofs, which are covered with vegetation, help to insulate buildings, reduce the urban heat island effect, and provide habitats for wildlife. Similarly, green walls, or vertical gardens, improve air quality, enhance aesthetic appeal, and contribute to the overall well-being of building occupants.

In addition to these elements, students were shown examples of sustainable landscaping on campus. This includes the use of native plants that require minimal water and maintenance, as well as the incorporation of rain gardens and bioswales to manage stormwater runoff. These features not only create beautiful and functional landscapes but also support local biodiversity and ecosystem health.

Throughout the session, students were encouraged to think critically about the design choices they observed and to consider how these principles could be applied in their own projects and communities. By fostering a deeper understanding of sustainable design, we aim to empower the next generation of designers and

architects to create more sustainable and resilient built environments.

In conclusion, these sessions on water management, waste management, and sustainable design provided students with valuable insights into the innovative practices that underpin our commitment to sustainability. By engaging with these topics, students gained a deeper appreciation for the importance of environmental stewardship and were equipped with the knowledge and skills to contribute to a more sustainable future.


Fig 1 Collaboration of Architecture







The School of Design at Sushant University organized an enriching cultural exchange program for its students in collaboration with King Mongkut's University of Technology Thonburi (KMUTT) in Thailand. Another notable project was the creation of decorative pottery items that incorporated Indian miniature painting styles with Thai ceramic craftsmanship, resulting in visually striking and culturally rich souvenirs.

They learned about sustainable design practices, product development, and marketing strategies, equipping them with the knowledge and skills needed to bring their ideas to fruition. Achieving green building certifications, such as LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) or BREEAM (Building Research Establishment Environmental Assessment Method), provides a structured framework for implementing sustainable practices. These certifications require adherence to stringent criteria for energy performance, water efficiency, indoor air quality, and resource use. CSE encourages adopting these standards to drive systemic changes in building practices and ensure environmental sustainability.




Fig-: 1 Speaker explaining the Concepts
