## DESCRIPTION :

  - One of the most pressing issues to be addressed is the negative impact gender stereotypes have on mental health. Participants will explore how gender expectations lead to stress, anxiety, and depression, especially when individuals feel they do not conform to societal norms. 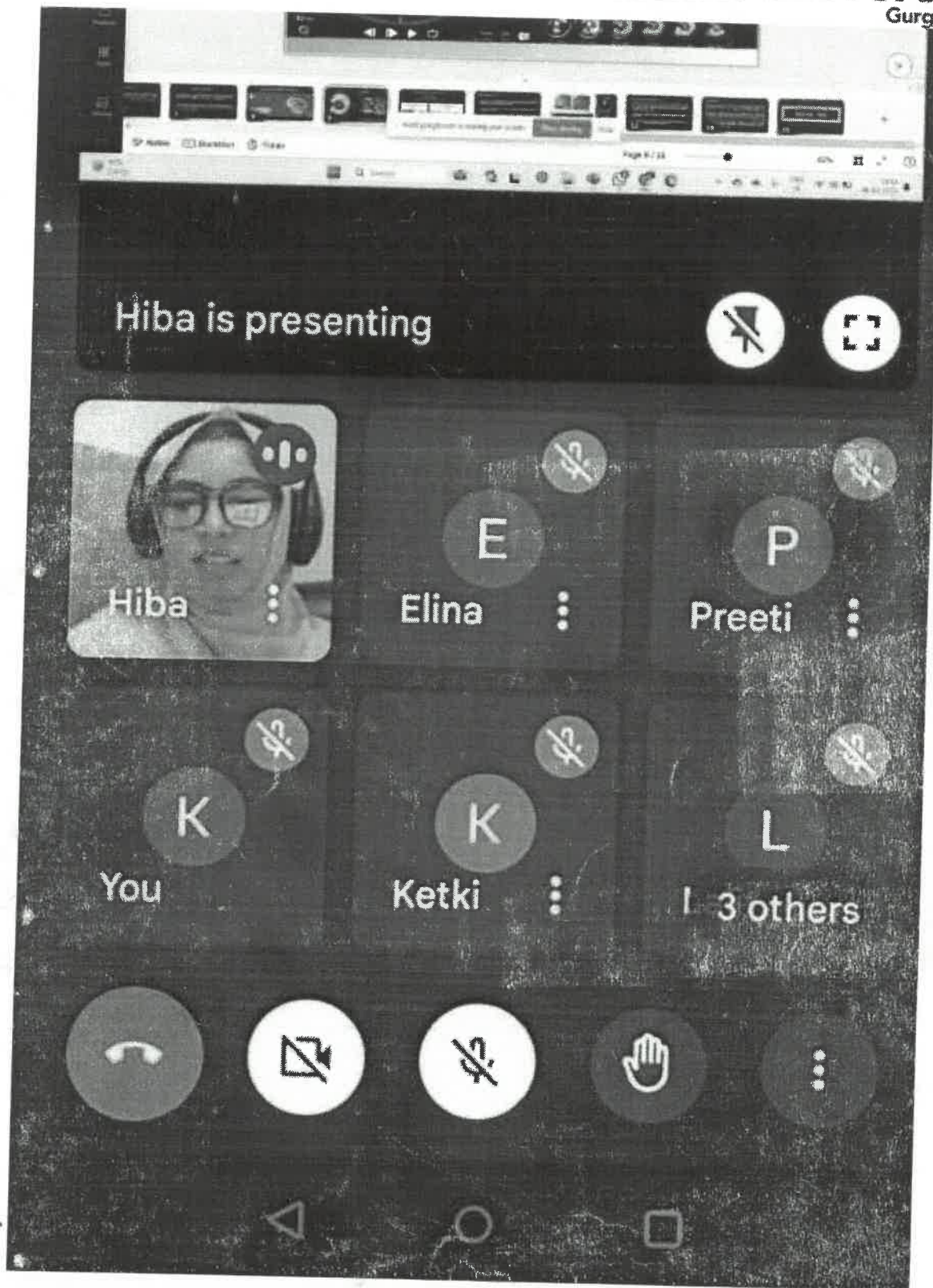
### Interactive Sessions and Expert Insights:

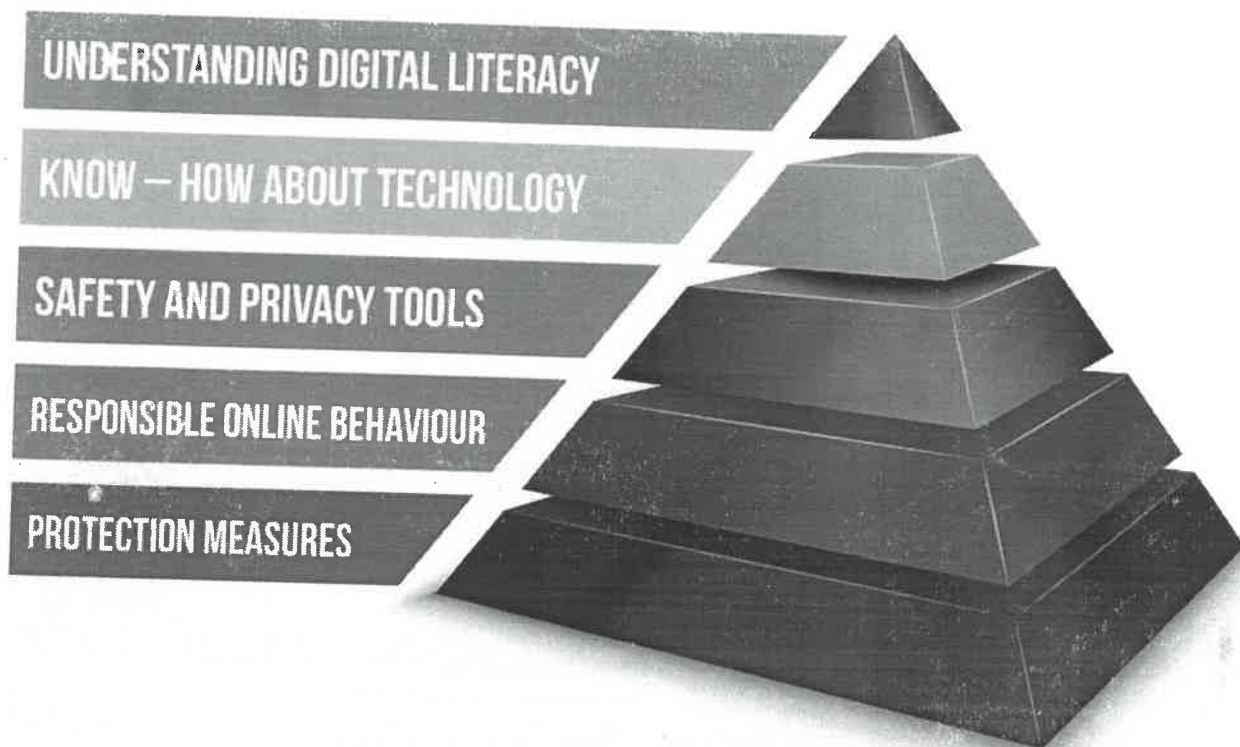

The Program will be a three hour long interactive activity with girls and women, focusing on the following among various other aspects of cyberspace and related issues:

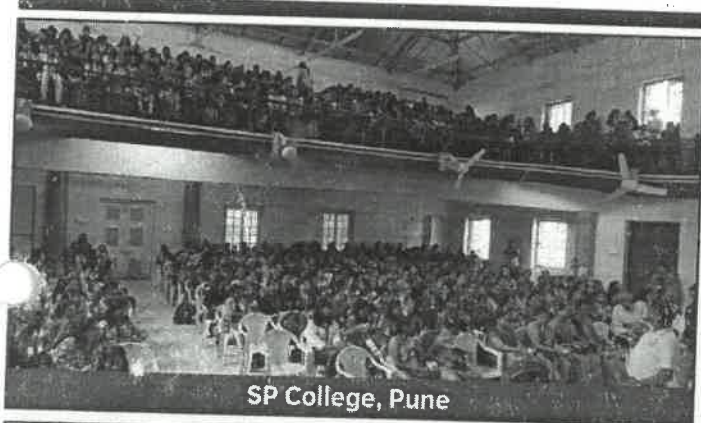

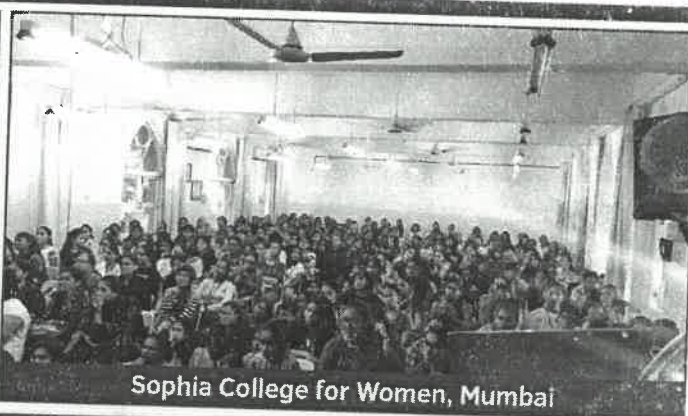

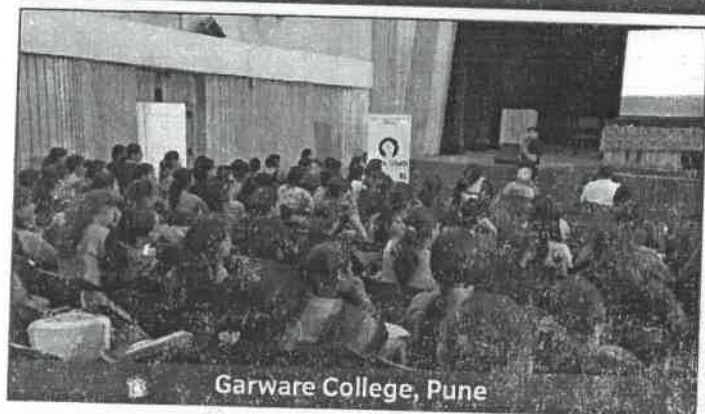

### **Description :**

Ansal university invited Advocate Sapna malik from ABC legal firm to conduct a session on Sexual harassment at workplace for the students and faculty of Ansal university on 30<sup>th</sup> July 2019.

*Can I hug my colleague at work **without asking**, or is this sexual harassment?*

*Is it OK to comment on a woman's body?*

When, in fact, does harassment start? It is helpful to note, from the start, that any form of harassment is usually humiliating and degrading and threatens the physical and mental integrity of a person. The Istanbul Convention of the Council of Europe defines sexual harassment as:

*"any form of unwanted verbal, non-verbal or physical conduct of a sexual nature with the purpose or effect of violating the dignity of a person, in particular when creating an intimidating, hostile, degrading, humiliating or offensive environment."*

Harassment and sexual harassment are also defined in EU Directive 2002/73/EC16.

**Harassment** is said to occur *"where an unwanted conduct related to the sex of a person occurs with the purpose or effect of violating the dignity of a person, and of creating an intimidating, hostile, degrading, humiliating or offensive environment"*.

Advocate Sapna enlightened the students and faculty about the laws of POSH and how to file a complaint against harassment and also made them aware about the importance of awareness about the same.
