GENDER SENSITIZATION POLICY

1. Introduction:

5. Responsibilities:

They shall focus on advancing knowledge, supporting research initiatives, and fostering a gender-inclusive academic environment.
- 5.2. Student Support Group: Students Support Group will provide support and resources to address gender-related issues and will organize awareness programs and workshops for fellow students.

6. Education and Training:

6.1. Faculty, staff, and administrators will undergo periodic training and development sessions to stay informed about evolving best practices, legislation, and societal attitudes related to gender sensitivity.



6.2. Professional development opportunities will be provided to ensure that all members of the University community are equipped with the knowledge and skills necessary to contribute to a gender-inclusive environment.

7. Reporting Mechanism:

- 7.1. The University encourages the prompt reporting of any incidents of gender-based discrimination or harassment through established channels, including academic advisors, faculty members, and dedicated reporting mechanisms.






























Counselling

The psychological Counseling centre shall serve every day of the week during working hours under the supervision of Dr. <u>Sagarika</u> and her team.


