Subject: Change in Eligibility for Admission to B.Arch. Course – reg.

Dear Sir/ Madam.

I would like to bring to your kind notice that the Council of Architecture at its 64<sup>th</sup> Meeting held on 27<sup>th</sup> August, 2015, decided to fix the eligibility for admission to B.Arch. Course as 10+2 with PCM subjects and 50% marks in Aggregate.

In the terms of the provisions of the Architects Act, 1972, the same was submitted to the Central Government for approval and amending the eligibility criteria as prescribed in the COA Regulations of 1983.

The Ministry of HRD vide letter no.F.No.4-65/2016-TS.VI dated 19.01.2017, has conveyed its approval for amendment in the eligibility for admission to B.Arch. Course. A copy of the same is enclosed herewith for your information and record.

Amendment of COA (Minimum Standards of Architectural Education) Regulations, 1983-reg.

Sir.

I am directed to refer your letter no. CA/1/2016/Regulations dated the 15<sup>th</sup> Oct, 2016 on the subject mentioned above and to say that the Council's proposal for amendment of regulations 4(1) of the Council of Architecture (Minimum Standards of Architectural Education) Regulations, 1983 relating to admission to the architecture course has been considered by this Ministry. This Ministry have no objection to the amendment of regulation 4(1) of the said Regulations by replacing Mathematics and English as subjects of examination for admission to five year B. Arch. Course with 50% marks in Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics and also 50% marks in aggregate at 10+2 level of examination. Accordingly, necessary action may be taken to replace the existing regulations 4(1) and 4(2) of the said Regulation by the following proposed clause:-

"No candidate shall be admitted to the architecture course unless she / he has passed an examination at the end of the 10+2 scheme of examination with 50% marks in Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics and also 50% marks in aggregate of the 10+2 level examination".

This issues with the approval of Competent Authority.
